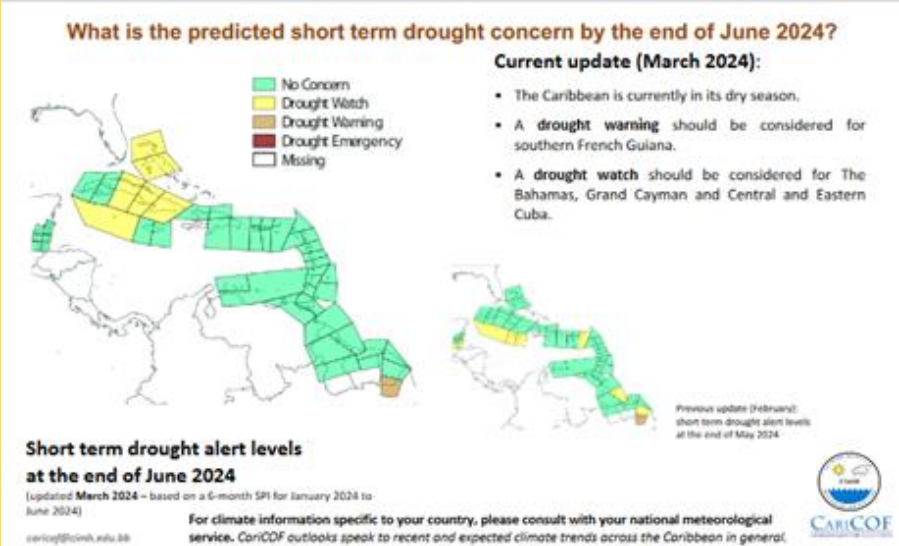




BAHAMAS TEMPERATURE & RAINFALL OUTLOOK

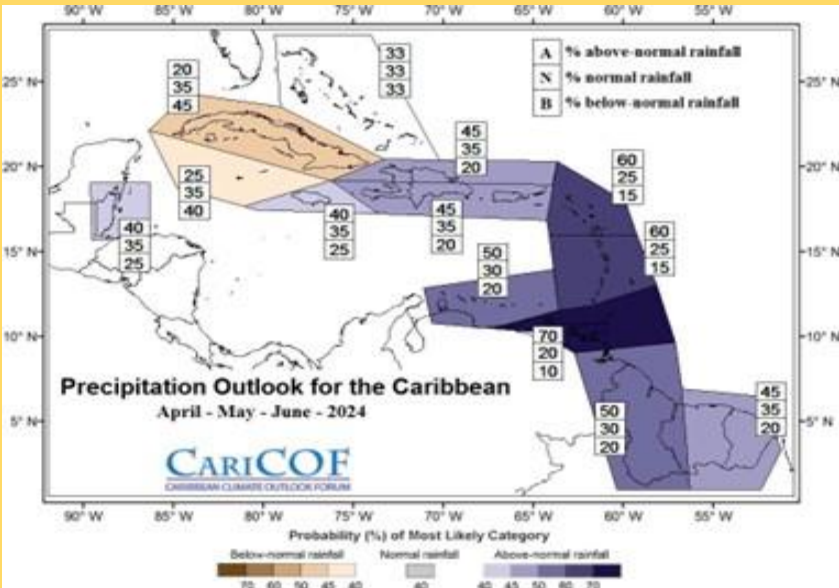


April to June, 2024 Drought Outlook



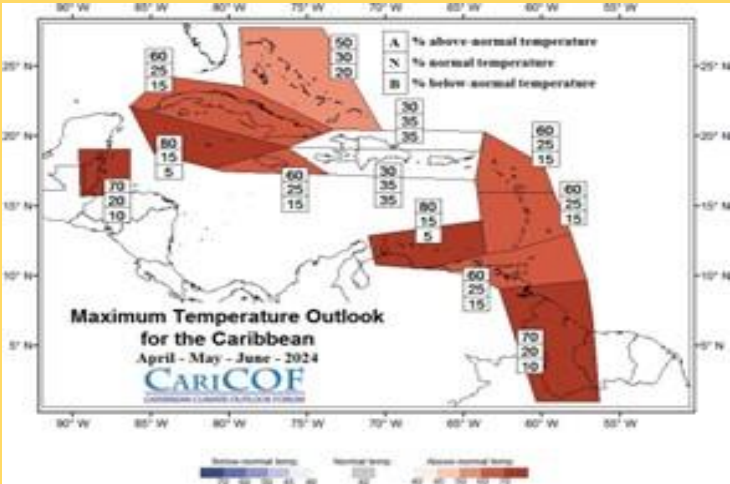
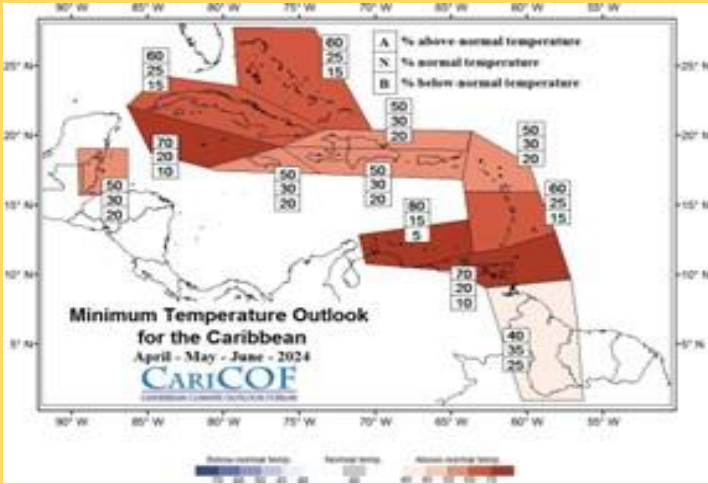
Short-term drought may possibly develop in The Bahamas during the period April to June 2024.

April to June 2024 Rainfall Outlook



Rainfall totals from April to June, in The Bahamas, are likely to be usual or even less than usual.

April to June 2024 Temperature Outlook



April to June night-time (minimum) and daytime (maximum) temperatures will likely be higher than usual.
Frequent episodes of heat stress are expected

Climate Outlook June to August 2024

The 2023 or 2024 El Niño was one of the strongest on record, but it is now weakening. There is a transition from El Niño to ENSO-neutral likely by April – June, with a La Niña developing by June – August. Also, the tropical North Atlantic Ocean is forecast to remain unseasonably warm. As a result, the 2024 Atlantic Hurricane Season is likely to be very active. Unusually high air temperatures and humidity, with the occurrence of significant to potentially record-breaking heat stress expected to evolve.
