


BAHAMAS TEMPERATURE & RAINFALL OUTLOOK


March to May, 2024 Drought Outlook,






There is no concern for short-term drought in the Bahamas during the period March to May 2024.


March to May 2024 Rainfall Outlook



Rainfall totals from March to May, in The Bahamas, are likely to below average.

March to May 2024 Temperature Outlook





March to May night-time minimum temperaturea, in The Bahamas, are forecast to be higher than usual to usual. March to May daytime maximum temperatures, in The Bahamas are likely to be below normal to normal.

Climate Outlook June to August 2024

Currently the average sea surface temperatures in the Tropical Atlantic are running about 2° Fahrenheit above the 1990-2020 normal. Seasonal prediction models are confident that there will be a transition from El Niño to neutral conditions during spring this year followed by a La Niña during the summer. The combination of high sea surf temperatures and La Niña means a very active hurricane season is likely.
