GENERAL SITUATION: A BROAD SURFACE TO MID-LEVEL RIDGE ACROSS THE FORECAST AREA
 WILL REMAIN IN CONTROL OF THE OVERALL WEATHER PATTERN TO CLOSE OUT THE WEEKEND
 AND KICK OFF THE WORKWEEK. MEANWHILE, A WEAK MID TO UPPER-LEVEL TROUGH WILL
 CONTINUE MOVING EASTWARD ACROSS THE ISLANDS TONIGHT AND SUNDAY HELPING TO
 TRIGGER ISOLATED SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS MOSTLY OFFSHORE.

AREA: EXTREME NORTHWEST BAHAMAS (GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI, AND THEIR ADJACENT WATERS)

ADVISORY: *SMALL CRAFT CAUTION IS IN EFFECT*....GUSTY WINDS, HIGHER SEAS, AND
 REDUCED VISIBILITY ARE LIKELY NEAR OR IN THUNDERSTORMS OR HEAVY SHOWERS

WINDS: EAST TO SOUTHEAST 15 TO 20 KNOTS BUT GUSTY AT TIMES.

LOCAL SEAS: 1 TO 3 FEET OVER SHELTERED NEAR COASTAL WATERS AND 4 TO 6 FEET OVER
 OPEN AND ATLANTIC EXPOSED WATERS

GULF STREAM: 3 TO 5 FEET

SWELLS: ... NO SIGNIFICANT SWELL...

WEATHER: GENERALLY FAIR, BREEZY AND MILD TONIGHT WITH A SLIGHT CHANCE OF AN
 ISOLATED SHOWER OR A ROGUE THUNDERSTORM. MOSTLY SUNNY, A BIT BREEZY AND VERY
 WARM TOMORROW WITH A SLIGHT CHANCE OF ISOLATED SHOWERS OR THUNDERSTORMS
 MAINLY DURING THE AFTERNOON.
