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MARINE FORECAST FOR THE EXTREME NORTHWEST BAHAMAS FOR 24 HOURS 6 PM THURSDAY 25TH APRIL 2024 ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 2300UTC.

SPECIAL WARNINGS: THE PUBLIC IS ADVISED OF THE LIGHT RISK OF RIP CURRENTS TONIGHT WHICH WILL INCREASE TOMORROW NIGHT.

GENERAL SITUATION: BENIGN BOATING CONDITIONS FOR THE REGION AS HIGH PRESSURE REMAINS IN CONTROL. THE WINDS WILL INCREASE FOR THE WEEKEND FORECAST AS THE PRESSURE GRADIENT TIGHTS. THE TRANQUIL PATTERN WILL DETERIORATE AS FRESH TO STRONG BREEZES FLOW IN FROM THE ATLANTIC.

AREA: (GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI, AND THEIR ADJACENT WATERS)

ADVISORY: NONE

WINDS: NORTHEAST TO EAST AROUND 10 KNOTS TONIGHT BECOMING 15 TO 25 KNOTS TOMORROW.

LOCAL SEAS: LESS THAN 2 FEET LOCALLY AND 3 TO 4 FEET FOR THE ATLANTIC EXPOSED WATERS.

GULF STREAM: UP TO 3 FEET
