BAHAMAS PUBLIC FORECAST FOR THIS AFTERNOON AND TONIGHT AND THE NEXT SIX (6) DAYS, ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT, MONDAY, JUNE 1, 2026. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNING IN EFFECT:

A moist unstable airmass streaming across the Northern and Northwestern islands along with a weakening frontal boundary near the Central Bahamas, continues to produce a few isolated showers and thunderstorms. Expect hot and humid conditions along with light to gentle winds across the island chain while a plume of Saharan dust will move into the Southeastern islands producing hazy skies.

GENERAL SITUATION:

Outlook: The frontal boundary is expected to move east of the Bahamas tonight. Meanwhile, a low-pressure system moving off the coast of Georgia, along with an associated cold front, will approach the Northern Bahamas on Tuesday. This system will help draw tropical moisture across the Northern and Northwest Bahamas over the next several days, increasing the likelihood of showers and thunderstorms. Across the Southern Bahamas, a brief but significant intrusion of Saharan dust is expected through Thursday, resulting in hazy skies and reduced air quality. By late Wednesday into early Thursday, a late-season cold front may drift into the Northern Bahamas and gradually weaken, pushing much of the moisture southward. As a result, unsettled and wet weather conditions are expected to persist across the Central and Southeast Bahamas into next weekend.

Saharan Dust: There is a **moderate** level of Saharan dust moving across the **Southeast Bahamas**, and the Turks and Caicos Islands which may impact air quality and hinder visibility to some degree. Persons with respiratory issues should take the necessary precautions to safeguard their health.

SPECIAL WEATHER NOTES:

Heat and UV Index: Residents across The Bahamas are advised to remain hydrated, wear protective clothing and sunscreen and seek shaded areas while outside during peak sunshine hours (**12pm – 4pm**), as UV indices are expected to be in the **very high to extreme** range and heat indices can reach the **upper 90's**.

PRECIPITATION:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 30 to 50% chance of showers with thunderstorms. Central and Southeast Bahamas: 20% chance of showers. Northern Bahamas: West to northwest at 10 to 15 knots falling light and variable at night. Northwest Bahamas: Southwest to west at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable by nightfall.						
WINDS:	Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable by the afternoon hours.						
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EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR WEDNESDAY 3RD JUNE 2026.

SKY CONDITIONS:	Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: Mostly cloudy. Southeast Bahamas: Partly cloudy and hazy.						
PRECIPITATION:	Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: 30 – 50% chance of showers with thunderstorms. Southeast Bahamas: 10 – 20% chance of showers. Northern Bahamas: West-southwest to west-northwest at 10 to 15 knots, veering north to northeast at 15 knots with higher gusts by nightfall.						
WINDS:	Northwest Bahamas: South-southwest to west-southwest at 10 knots or less, veering northwesterly. Central and Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 10 knots or less increasing 10 to 15 knots in the Southeast Bahamas nightfall.						
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EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THURSDAY 4TH JUNE 2026.

SKY CONDITIONS:	Southeast Bahamas: Partly cloudy with hazy conditions in the Southeast Bahamas. Elsewhere: Partly cloudy to cloudy						
PRECIPITATION:	Southeast Bahamas: 10 to 30% chance of showers with possible thunderstorms. Elsewhere: 30 to 50% chance of showers with thunderstorms.						
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: North-northeast to east-northeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times. Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots.

	Central Bahamas: 30 – 50% chance of showers with thunderstorms.

WINDS:	All areas: East-northeast to east-southeast at 10 to 15 knots with occasionally higher gusts.
