



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT MONDAY, 1ST JUNE, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS: A *slight risk of rip currents* exists along all Atlantic-exposed beaches of the island chain.

GENERAL SITUATION: Moisture sitting over the archipelago is producing some spotty showers for the Northern and Northwest Bahamas with humid conditions for the Central and Southeast Bahamas. This weather pattern is expected to persist for the Northern and Northwest islands, while the Central and Southeast islands are expected to experience hazy and humid conditions due to an influx of Saharan dust.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: A *small craft caution* is in effect for Atlantic waters.

WINDS: Southwest to west at 10 to 15 knots.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.

GULF STREAM: 3 feet or less.

SWELLS: Light to moderate northeasterly swells in Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Chance of showers with possible thunderstorms.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: A *small craft caution* is in effect for Atlantic waters.

WINDS: South to southwest at 10 knots or less.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: Light northeasterly swells in Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Chance of showers with possible thunderstorms.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: Light and variable this afternoon, becoming east to southeast at 10 knots or less tonight.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: Light northeasterly swells in Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Slight chance of isolated showers.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 knots or less.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: Light northeasterly swells in Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Slight chance of isolated showers.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:

Tropical cyclone formation is not expected during the next 7 days.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR TUESDAY, 2ND JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: A *small craft caution* is in effect for all Atlantic-exposed waters.

WINDS: **Northern & Northwest Bahamas:** West to northwest at knots or less, falling light and variable by nightfall.
Central Bahamas: Variable at 10 knots or less.
Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 knots or less, occasionally falling light and variable at times.

SEAS: **All Areas:** 2 feet or less nearshore waters, 2 to 4 feet offshore sheltered waters, and 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.

PRECIPITATION: **Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas:** Chance of showers with thunderstorms.
Southeast Bahamas: Slight chance of showers.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR WEDNESDAY, 3RD JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: A *small craft caution* is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters of the **Southeast Bahamas**

WINDS: **Northern Bahamas:** West to northwest at 10 to 15 knots, veering north to northeast at 15 knots with higher gusts late Wednesday night.
Northwest Bahamas: Southwest to northwest at 10 knots or less, veering north to northeast at 10 to 15 knots late Wednesday night.
Central & Southeast Bahamas: Variable at 10 knots or less during the day, becoming northeasterly at 10 to 15 knots by nightfall.

SEAS: **Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas:** 2 feet or less in nearshore and sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet building to 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters Wednesday night.
Southeast Bahamas: 2 feet or less nearshore waters, 2 to 4 feet offshore sheltered waters, and 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.

PRECIPITATION: **Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas:** Chance of showers with thunderstorms.
Southeast Bahamas: Slight chance of showers.
