



## BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EST SATURDAY , JUNE 13<sup>TH</sup> , 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

**SPECIAL WARNINGS:** The **New Moon phase** will affect tidal ranges, which means **stronger tidal currents**, especially in or around waterways. Also, during low tides, shoals, dunes, and banks will be partially covered due to the phase, and the risk of running aground is much higher....

**North, Northwest & Central Bahamas:**

**Southeast Bahamas:**

**Low rip current risk** — Swimmers should remain vigilant.

### MARINE CONDITIONS:

**WARNING:** **Atlantic exposed:**

- **Southeast Bahamas:** Small craft should exercise caution.
- **Remaining Country:** None

**Open Waters, Nearshore & Sheltered:**

- **Southeast Bahamas:** Small craft should exercise caution.

With high pressure anchored just north of the Northwest Bahamas, calm to light easterly to southeasterly breezes will continue across much of the country. However, winds will gradually increase farther south, becoming moderate over the Southeast Bahamas.

**GENERAL SITUATION:** Sea conditions across the Northwest and Central Bahamas will remain relatively tranquil. In contrast, marine conditions are expected to deteriorate on Sunday across the southern islands, particularly in the Southeast Bahamas. As a result, a **Caution Flag** will be issued for local waters, while a **Small Craft Advisory** will come into effect for Atlantic-exposed waters.

While generally dry conditions are expected, the chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms cannot be ruled out. Any convective activity will be primarily driven by daytime heating and local sea-breeze interactions. Across the Central and Southeast Bahamas, the northern fringe of a tropical wave is expected to enhance moisture levels and increase the likelihood of showers and thunderstorms.

### **Outlook**

**Sunday & Monday:**

**OUTLOOK:** High pressure will remain the dominant weather feature across the region, resulting in generally stable conditions. Nevertheless, daytime heating and seabreeze effect will continue to support the development of isolated showers and thunderstorms during the afternoon and evening periods. A **near gale watch** will come into effect early Monday morning for the Southeast Bahamas due to gusts reaching the 30 knots threshold.

### NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** *None...outside of any thunderstorm activity...*

**WINDS:** East to southeast near 10 knots today becoming southeast to south 10 to 15 knots the afternoon into the overnight hours...

**LOCAL SEAS:** All areas- less than 2 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters- 2 to 3 feet.

**GULF STREAM:** Less than 2 feet

**SWELLS:** Light east for the Atlantic exposed

**WEATHER:** Mostly to partly sunny with the chance for afternoon showers and isolated thunderstorms.



**NORTHWEST BAHAMAS**

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** *None...outside of any thunderstorm activity...*  
**WINDS:** East to southeast near 10 knots today becoming southeast to south 10 to 15 knots the afternoon into the overnight hours...  
**LOCAL SEAS:** All areas- less than 2 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters- 2 to 3 feet.  
**SWELLS:** Light east for the Atlantic exposed  
**WEATHER:** Mostly to partly sunny with the chance for afternoon showers and isolated thunderstorms.

**CENTRAL BAHAMAS**

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** *None...outside of any thunderstorm activity...*  
**WINDS:** East to southeast 10 to 15 knots today becoming 15 knots the afternoon into the overnight hours with higher gusts...  
**LOCAL SEAS:** All areas- less than 2 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters- 2 to 3 feet.  
**SWELLS:** Light east-northeast for the Atlantic exposed  
**WEATHER:** Mostly to partly sunny with the chance for afternoon showers and isolated thunderstorms.

**SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS**

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** *Small craft should exercise caution...Winds and seas will be higher due to thunderstorm activity.*  
**WINDS:** East 12 to 18 knots today becoming 15 to 20 knots for the overnight hours...  
**LOCAL SEAS:** All areas- 2 to 3 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters- 3 to 4 feet.  
**SWELLS:** Light to moderate east-northeast for the Atlantic exposed  
**WEATHER:** Mostly to partly sunny with the chance for showers and thunderstorms.

**TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:**

**Official Hurricane Season:** June 1 – November 30, 2025.

**1. Southwestern Gulf:**

A broad area of low pressure just offshore of eastern Mexico continues to produce some shower and thunderstorm activity. While this system has become better organized since yesterday, marginal environmental conditions will probably prevent significant development before the low moves inland over eastern Mexico by Sunday. The system could re-emerge over the northwestern Gulf on Tuesday or Wednesday while interacting with a frontal boundary, but conditions there are also expected to be only marginally conducive for development.

<b>ADVISORY:</b>	<b>Central Bahamas:</b> Moderate risk for thunderstorm activity <b>Remaining Bahamas:</b> Low risk for thunderstorm activity <b>Southeast Bahamas:</b> Small craft advisory for the Atlantic waters...
<b>WINDS:</b>	<b>North Bahamas-</b> Southeast to south less than 10 knots becoming south 10 knots overnight. <b>Northwest Bahamas</b> – Southeast near 10 knots becoming southeast to south 10 knots overnight. <b>Central Bahamas</b> - East 10 knots winds with higher gusts <b>Southeast Bahamas</b> - East 10 to 15 knots becoming 15 to 20 knots winds with higher gusts
<b>SEAS:</b>	<b>North, Northwest to Central Bahamas</b> – All areas less than 2 feet; Atlantic exposed waters–2 to 3 feet <b>Southeast Bahamas</b> – Sheltered areas- 1 to 3 feet; open waters – 2 to 4 feet, all passage-3 to 4 feet and the Atlantic exposed waters– 4 to 5 feet
<b>SWELLS:</b>	<b>North, Northwest &amp; Central Bahamas:</b> Light east swells for the Atlantic waters. <b>Southeast Bahamas:</b> Light to moderate east-southeast swells for the Atlantic waters.
<b>PRECIPITATION:</b>	<b>Remaining Bahamas:</b> Low risk for the showers and possible thunderstorms. <b>Central &amp; Southeast Bahamas:</b> Moderate risk for showers and thunderstorms...

<b>ADVISORY:</b>	<b>Near-gale watch for the Southeast Bahamas</b> <b>North &amp; Northwest Bahamas:</b> Light to moderate risk for thunderstorm activity <b>Remaining Bahamas:</b> Low risk for thunderstorm activity <b>Southeast Bahamas:</b> Small craft should remain in port...
<b>WINDS:</b>	<b>North Bahamas-</b> South to southwest 10 knots. <b>Northwest Bahamas</b> – Southeast to south near 10 knots becoming east to southeast 10 knots overnight. <b>Central Bahamas</b> – Southeast to east 10 knots winds with higher gusts <b>Southeast Bahamas</b> - East 10 to 15 knots becoming 15 to 20 knots winds with higher gusts
<b>SEAS:</b>	<b>North, Northwest to Central Bahamas</b> – All areas less than 2 feet; Atlantic exposed waters–3 to 4 feet <b>Southeast Bahamas</b> – Sheltered areas- 1 to 3 feet; open waters – 4 to 5 feet, all passage and the Atlantic exposed waters-5 feet
<b>SWELLS:</b>	<b>North, Northwest &amp; Central Bahamas:</b> Light east-southeast swells for the Atlantic waters. <b>Southeast Bahamas:</b> Moderate to large east-southeast swells for the Atlantic waters.
<b>PRECIPITATION:</b>	<b>Remaining Bahamas:</b> Low risk for the showers and possible thunderstorms. <b>North &amp; Northwest Bahamas:</b> Low to moderate risk for showers and thunderstorms...
