MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EST SUNDAY, JUNE 14TH, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

SPECIAL WARNINGS: The **New Moon phase** will affect tidal ranges, which means **stronger tidal currents**, especially in or around waterways. Also, during low tides, shoals, dunes, and banks will be partially covered due to the phase, and the risk of running aground is much higher....

GENERAL SITUATION:

A strong area of high pressure is maintaining generally favorable conditions for marine activities across the northern Bahamas, with lighter winds and relatively calm seas. However, a mid-to-upper-level trough extending across the Northwest Bahamas is contributing to a tight pressure gradient over the southern half of the country. As a result, Winds will be stronger and gustier across the central and southern Bahamas. Seas will be choppy to rough, for the Southeast Bahamas, creating hazards for small craft operators.

Outlook

Monday & Tuesday:

OUTLOOK:

The weather pattern across the region is expected to remain largely unchanged due to a combination of a surface high-pressure ridge and a mid-to-upper-level trough. Daytime heating and local sea-breeze effects will continue to support the development of isolated showers and thunderstorms during the afternoon hours for the northern half of the country, while the southern islands' seas will deteriorate due to moderate to fresh breezes. A near gale warning for the Inagua and its adjacent waters after midnight on Monday.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** *None...outside of any thunderstorm activity...*
- WINDS:** South around 10 knots today becoming south to southwest overnight...
- LOCAL SEAS:** All areas- less than 2 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters- 2 to 3 feet.
- GULF STREAM:** Less than 2 feet
- SWELLS:** Light east for the Atlantic exposed
- WEATHER:** Mostly to partly sunny with the chance for afternoon showers and isolated thunderstorms.



NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** *None...outside of any thunderstorm activity...*
- WINDS:** Southeast to south 10 to 15 knots today becoming to south overnight...
- LOCAL SEAS:** All areas- less than 2 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters- 2 to 3 feet.
- SWELLS:** Light east for the Atlantic exposed
- WEATHER:** Mostly to partly sunny with the chance for afternoon showers and isolated thunderstorms.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** *None...outside of any thunderstorm activity...*
- WINDS:** East to southeast 10 to 15 knots today becoming 15 knots overnight hours with higher gusts...
- LOCAL SEAS:** All areas- less than 2 feet; Crooked Island passage- 1 to 3 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters- 2 to 4 feet.
- SWELLS:** Light east-northeast for the Atlantic exposed
- WEATHER:** Partly sunny to partly cloudy with the chance for afternoon showers and isolated thunderstorms.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** *Small craft should exercise caution...Winds and seas will be higher due to thunderstorm activity.*
- WINDS:** East 12 to 18 knots today becoming near 20 knots with gusts up to 30 knots overnight..
- LOCAL SEAS:** All areas- 2 to 3 feet; Mayaguana passage-2 to 4 feet; Caicos passage- 3 to 5 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters- 5 feet.
- SWELLS:** Light to moderate east-northeast for the Atlantic exposed
- WEATHER:** Mostly to partly cloudy with the chance for showers and thunderstorms.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:

Official Hurricane Season: June 1 – November 30, 2025.

Northwestern Gulf of America:

A broad area of low pressure located over eastern Mexico is producing disorganized shower and thunderstorm activity. Development is not expected during the next day or so while the low remains inland over northeastern Mexico or southern Texas during the next day or so. The system could then re-emerge over the northwestern Gulf of America around midweek while interacting with a frontal boundary, but conditions there are expected to be only marginally conducive for development.

**EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR MONDAY, JUNE 15TH, 2026:**

ADVISORY: **Near-gale warning for the Southeast Bahamas early the morning**
North & Northwest Bahamas: Light to moderate risk for thunderstorm activity
Remaining Bahamas: Low risk for thunderstorm activity
Southeast Bahamas: Small craft should remain in port...

WINDS: **North Bahamas-** South to southwest 10 knots.
Northwest Bahamas – Southeast to south near 10 knots becoming east to southeast 10 knots overnight.
Central Bahamas – East 10 knots becoming 15 knots overnight, with higher gusts
Southeast Bahamas - East 15 knots becoming 15 to 20 knots overnight with higher gusts

SEAS: **North, Northwest to Central Bahamas** – All areas less than 2 feet; Crooked Island- 3 feet;
Atlantic exposed waters–3 to 4 feet
Southeast Bahamas – Sheltered areas- 1 to 3 feet; open waters – 4 to 5 feet, all passage and the Atlantic exposed waters-5 feet

SWELLS: **North, Northwest & Central Bahamas:** Light east-southeast swells for the Atlantic waters.
Southeast Bahamas: Moderate to large east-southeast swells for the Atlantic waters.

PRECIPITATION: **Remaining Bahamas:** Low risk for the showers and possible thunderstorms.
North & Northwest Bahamas: Low to moderate risk for showers and thunderstorms...

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR TUESDAY, JUNE 16TH, 2026:

WINDS: **North Bahamas-** South to southwest 15 knots.
Northwest & Central Bahamas – Southeast to south near 10 knots becoming east to southeast 10 knots overnight.
Southeast Bahamas - East 15 knots becoming 15 to 20 knots overnight with higher gusts

SEAS: **North, Northwest to Central Bahamas** – All areas less than 2 feet; Crooked Island- 3 feet;
Atlantic exposed waters–3 to 4 feet
Southeast Bahamas – Sheltered areas- 1 to 3 feet; open waters – 3 feet, all passage- 3 to 4 feet; and the Atlantic exposed waters-5 feet

SWELLS: **North, Northwest & Central Bahamas:** Light east-southeast swells for the Atlantic waters.
Southeast Bahamas: Moderate east-southeast swells for the Atlantic waters.

PRECIPITATION: **Remaining Bahamas:** Low risk for the showers and possible thunderstorms.
North & Northwest Bahamas: Low to moderate risk for showers and thunderstorms...
