



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT THURSDAY, 11TH JUNE, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS: There is a *slight risk* of rip currents on the Atlantic waters of The Bahamas. *Beachgoers and swimmers visiting beaches in these areas are urged to exercise caution.*

GENERAL SITUATION: Weak ridging continues to dominate the weather across the archipelago, maintaining gentle to moderate breezes. Gentle breezes and favorable boating conditions will persist for the remainder of the work week. On Saturday, a tropical wave and its associated moisture, is expected to increase shower and thunderstorm chances over the southern half of the country.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: Easterly at 10 knots or less.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less in nearshore, open waters and Atlantic waters.

GULF STREAM: Less than 2 feet.

SWELLS: Light mixed swells in Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Slight chance of showers.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: Easterly at 10 knots or less.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less in nearshore, open waters and Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: Light easterly swells in Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Slight chance of showers.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: Easterly at 10 knots or less.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less in nearshore, open waters and Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: Light easterly swells in Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Slight chance of showers.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less in nearshore, open waters and Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: Light easterly swells in Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Slight chance of showers.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:
 A broad area of low pressure could form over the Bay of Campeche on Friday from a westward-moving tropical wave currently located near the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico. **Formation chance through 7 days is low at 10 percent.**

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY, 12TH JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: **Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas:** East to southeast at 10 knots or less.
Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots.

SEAS: **All Areas:** 2 feet or less in nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 3 feet or less in Atlantic-exposed waters.

WEATHER: **All Areas:** Slight chance of showers.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SATURDAY, 13TH JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: **Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas:** Variable at 10 knots or less, becoming east to southeast at 10 to 15 knots across the Central Bahamas Saturday night.
Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts.

SEAS: **Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas:** 2 feet or less in nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 3 feet or less in Atlantic-exposed waters.
Southeast Bahamas: 2 feet or less in nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.

PRECIPITATION: **Northern & Northwest Bahamas:** Slight chance of showers or an isolated thunderstorm.
Central & Southeast Bahamas: Chance of showers and isolated thunderstorms.
