



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT DAY, JUNE, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

There is a *slight to moderate risk* of rip currents on the Atlantic waters of the Central and Southeast Bahamas. *Beachgoers, particularly those in the Southeast Bahamas, should exercise caution when entering the water.*

WARNINGS:

A Heat Advisory is now in effect for the *Northern and Northwest Bahamas (inclusive of the islands of New Providence, Grand Bahama, Bimini, Abaco, The Berry Islands, Andros and Bimini.)* The public should remain hydrated, limit strenuous outdoor activities and seek shaded areas during peak heat hours.

GENERAL SITUATION:

Ridging over the archipelago continues to maintain mostly stable conditions and gentle breezes over majority of the archipelago with brisk breezes and rougher seas for the Central and Southeast Bahamas, these conditions are expected to persist through tomorrow. Boaters should expect higher chances of isolated thunderstorm activity in the afternoon hours due to daytime heating. By Saturday, a trough near the Northern Bahamas is expected to increase shower and thunderstorm activity over the northern islands.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** *None.*
- WINDS:** Southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters through tomorrow.
- GULF STREAM:** Less than 2 feet.
- SWELLS:** Light easterly swells in Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Slight chance of isolated showers with a slight chance of an isolated thunderstorm.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** *None.*
- WINDS:** Southeasterly at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** Light easterly swells in Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Slight chance of isolated showers with a slight chance of an isolated thunderstorm.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** *Small craft caution* in Atlantic waters.
- WINDS:** Southeasterly at 15 knots with higher gusts.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** Light mixed swells in Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Slight chance of isolated showers.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** *Small craft advisory* in Atlantic waters.
Small craft caution in open waters.
- WINDS:** Easterly at 15 to 20 knots with higher gusts.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less in nearshore waters, 3 to 5 feet in open waters, 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** Light mixed swells in Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Slight chance of isolated showers.

Offshore East Coast of the United States (Remnants of Arthur): Showers and thunderstorms associated with a trough of low pressure (the remnants of Arthur) are located over the southeastern United States. Formation chance through 7 days is low at 10 percent.</p> <p><i>Elsewhere, tropical cyclone formation is not expected during the next 7 days.</i></p> |

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY, 19TH JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: *Small craft advisory* in Atlantic waters of the Southeast Bahamas.
Small craft caution in open waters of the Southeast Bahamas and Atlantic waters of the Central Bahamas.

WINDS: **Northern and Northwest Bahamas:** Southeasterly at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts.
Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots with higher gusts.

SEAS: **Northern and Northwest Bahamas:** 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters.
Central Bahamas: 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.
Southeast Bahamas: 3 feet or less in nearshore waters, 3 to 5 feet in open waters, 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.

PRECIPITATION: **Northern Bahamas:** Slight chance of isolated showers with a slight chance of an isolated thunderstorm.
Elsewhere: Slight chance of isolated showers.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SATURDAY, 20TH JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: *Small craft advisory* in Atlantic waters of the Southeast Bahamas.
Small craft caution in open waters of the Southeast Bahamas.

WINDS: **Northern and Northwest Bahamas:** Southeast to south at 10 knots or less, becoming light and variable in the afternoon.
Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots falling light and variable at times.

SEAS: **Southeast Bahamas:** 3 feet or less in nearshore waters, 3 to 5 feet in open waters, 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.
Elsewhere: 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters.

PRECIPITATION: **Northern Bahamas:** Chance of isolated showers with a slight chance of an isolated thunderstorm.
Elsewhere: Slight chance of isolated showers.
