



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT TUESDAY, 2ND JUNE, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

A **Saharan Dust Advisory** is now in effect for the **Southeast Bahamas and the Turks and Caicos Islands** and will come into effect for the Central Bahamas on Wednesday. Air Quality Index (AQI) will **be Moderate to Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups**, and visibility may be significantly reduced beginning today through to Wednesday. *People with respiratory or heart disease, the elderly and children should limit prolonged exposure by remaining indoors and wearing masks during this event.*

WARNINGS:

There is a **moderate risk** of rip currents on the Atlantic waters of the Northern and Southeast Bahamas.

GENERAL SITUATION:

Moisture from a trailing frontal boundary near Abaco continues to maintain showers and isolated thunderstorms over the Northern and Northwest islands. Hazy and humid conditions are expected for the Southeast islands due to an influx of Saharan dust.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** A **small craft caution** is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters.
- WINDS:** Light and variable this afternoon, becoming northerly at 10 knots or less tonight.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.
- GULF STREAM:** 3 to 5 feet.
- SWELLS:** Light northeasterly swells in Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Chance of showers with possible isolated thunderstorms.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** A **small craft caution** is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters.
- WINDS:** Light and variable.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** Light northeasterly swells in Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Chance of showers with possible isolated thunderstorms.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** A **small craft caution** is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters.
- WINDS:** Northeast to east at 10 knots or less.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** Light northeasterly swells in Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Chance of showers with possible isolated thunderstorms.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** A **small craft caution** is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters.
- WINDS:** Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less in nearshore waters, 2 to 4 feet in open waters, 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** Light northeasterly swells in Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Slight chance of isolated showers.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:
Tropical cyclone formation is not expected during the next 7 days.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR WEDNESDAY, 3RD JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: Southeast Bahamas: A *small craft caution* is in effect for all Atlantic-exposed waters.
Northern Bahamas: Light and variable, becoming northwest to north at 10 knots, before becoming north to northeast at 15 to 20 knots with higher gusts
Northwest Bahamas: Easterly at less than 10 knots, falling light and variable during the afternoon hours, shifting north to northeast at 10 to 15 knots by the evening.

WINDS: Central and Southeast Bahamas: Northeast to east at 10 knots or less, but 10 to 15 knots across portions of the Southeast Bahamas, becoming northeast to east at 10 knots or less across the Central Bahamas and east to southeast across the Southeast Bahamas by the evening.

SEAS: Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas: 2 feet or less in nearshore and sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet building to 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters by nightfall Wednesday.
Southeast Bahamas: 2 feet or less nearshore waters, 2 to 4 feet offshore sheltered waters, and 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.

PRECIPITATION: Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas: Chance of showers with thunderstorms.
Southeast Bahamas: Slight chance of showers.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THURSDAY, 4TH JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: Northern & Northwest Bahamas: A *small craft advisory* is in effect for all Atlantic-exposed waters, while a *small craft caution* remains in effect for local waters.
Central & Southeast Bahamas: A *small craft caution* is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters.

WINDS: Northern Bahamas: Northeasterly at 15 to 20 knots during the morning hours, becoming 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts by the afternoon
Northwest Bahamas: Northeasterly at 10 knots or less, increasing to 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts by the evening hours.
Central Bahamas: Northeast to east at 10 knots or less, increasing to 10 to 15 knots across the northern-most islands by the evening
Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, decreasing to 10 knots or less by later afternoon through evening hours.

SEAS: Northern Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet nearshore waters, 4 to 6 feet offshore sheltered waters, and 6 to 8 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.
Northwest Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet nearshore waters, 4 to 6 feet offshore sheltered waters, and 5 to 7 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.
Central & Southeast Bahamas: 2 feet or less nearshore waters, 2 to 4 feet offshore sheltered waters, and 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.

PRECIPITATION: Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas: Chance of showers with thunderstorms.
Southeast Bahamas: Slight chance of showers.
