BAHAMAS PUBLIC FORECAST FOR THIS AFTERNOON, NIGHT AND THE NEXT SIX (6) DAYS, ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT, SATURDAY, APRIL 4, 2026. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EST.

WARNING IN EFFECT:	<p><i>There are no public warnings in effect at this time.</i></p> <p>A Near Gale Warning (28 – 33 knots) remains in effect for the Northwest, Central and Southeast Bahamas. GENERAL SITUATION:	<p>A broad high pressure system is supporting the fresh to strong breeze throughout the Bahamas while a mid to low level trough is creating unsettled weather across the country.</p> <p>Outlook: The mid-level disturbance and its associated moisture is anticipated to persist through the weekend over the Central & Southeast Bahamas, maintaining an elevated chance of scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms, some of which may become strong to severe at times. Meanwhile, winds will also remain fresh to strong and seas moderate to rough before gradually subsiding by early next week.</p> <p>Conditions will begin to improve briefly across the Bahamas beginning late Sunday through to Monday, as the disturbance drifts eastwards into the Atlantic. By late Tuesday, a prefrontal trough will approach the Northern Bahamas, introducing another round of showers, thunderstorms and potentially strong to gale force breezes and very rough seas over the Northern Bahamas and Gulf Stream waters into midweek.</p>
SPECIAL WEATHER NOTES:	<p>Coastal Flooding – Overtopping Waves: There is a moderate to high risk of overtopping waves along seawalls and coastal roads along Atlantic-exposed shorelines. A marginal risk of coastal flooding remains across all other northern and eastern-facing coastal roadways, mainly in the Central and Southeast Bahamas especially during high tide. Motorists and residents are urged to exercise extreme caution while traversing these areas.</p> <p>Flash Flooding: There is a marginal risk of flooding, mainly in low-lying and flood-prone areas, across portions of the Central and Southeast Bahamas beginning this afternoon and continuing through Sunday. The public is urged to exercise caution in these areas, especially during heavy and prolonged rainfall events.</p> <p>Rip Currents – Rough Surf: A high risk of dangerous, life-threatening rip currents and rough surf remains along all Atlantic-exposed beaches and all area waters of the Central and Southeast Bahamas, while a moderate risk exists over the sheltered northern territorial waters. Beachgoers and swimmers should avoid entering the water along all northern, eastern and Atlantic-exposed shorelines.</p>

PRECIPITATION:	Central & Southeast Bahamas: 40 – 60% chance of scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms. Northwest Bahamas: 20 – 30% chance of isolated showers. Northern Bahamas: 10 – 20% chance of a few isolated showers.		
WINDS:	Northern & Northwest Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots. Central & Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 15 to 25 knots with occasional gusts to near gale force.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR: MONDAY 06TH, APRIL 2026.			
SKY CONDITIONS:	Northern Bahamas: Partly sunny, turning partly cloudy at night. Northwest Bahamas: A mix of sun and clouds, turning mostly fair at night. Central and Southeast Bahamas: Partly cloudy to cloudy with gradual clearing throughout the day.		
PRECIPITATION:	Central & Southeast Bahamas: 20 – 30% chance of isolated showers, mainly offshore and east of the archipelago. Northern & Northwest Bahamas: 10 – 20% chance of isolated showers.		
WINDS:	Southeast Bahamas: Variable at 10 knots or less. Central Bahamas: Easterly at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times. Elsewhere: East-northeast to east-southeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times in the extreme Northern Islands.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR: TUESDAY 07TH, APRIL 2026.

SKY CONDITIONS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: A mix of sun and clouds, turning partly cloudy to cloudy by the evening hours across the Northern Bahamas Central and Southeast Bahamas: Partly sunny, turning mostly fair at night.		
PRECIPITATION:	Northern Bahamas: 10 to 30% chance of showers during the morning hours increasing to 40 to 50% chance by late afternoon along the frontal boundary. <i>Elsewhere:</i> 10 to 20% chance of showers.		
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Southeast at Easterly at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times, becoming southwest to west at less than 10 knots during the afternoon hours and becoming northwest to north at 10 knots by the evening hours, and north to northeast at 20 to 25 knots, with higher gusts up to gale force behind the front (mainly across the Northern Bahamas) overnight. Central and Southeast Bahamas: Southwest to west at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable overnight.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR: WEDNESDAY 08TH, APRIL 2026.

SKY CONDITIONS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Partly cloudy to cloudy. Central and Southeast Bahamas: A mix of sun and clouds, becoming mostly fair at night.		
PRECIPITATION:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 20 to 40% chance of showers with possible thunderstorms. Central and Southeast Bahamas: 20% chance of showers during the morning hours increasing to 20 to 30% chance of by the evening hours.		
WINDS:	Northern Bahamas: Northeasterly at 25 to 30 knots with gusts up to gale force Northwest Bahamas: Northeasterly at 10 to 15 knots during the morning hours, increasing to 15 to 25 knots by the afternoon hours with near gale gusts , and 25 to 30 knots with gusts up to gale force overnight Central and Southeast Bahamas: Southwest to west at 10 knots or less, veering west to northwest at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times. Increasing to 15 to 20 knots with higher gusts overnight.

PRECIPITATION:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 20 to 40% chance of showers and isolated thunderstorms, decreasing to 10 to 20% chance by the evening hours Central and Southeast Bahamas: 20 to 30% chance of showers with possible thunderstorms.		
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Northeast at 20 to 30 knots with possible gusts to gale force . Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts, becoming light and variable across portions of the Central Bahamas by the afternoon hours and across the Southeast Bahamas by the evening hours.
