BAHAMAS PUBLIC FORECAST FOR THIS AFTERNOON, –NIGHT AND THE NEXT SIX (6) DAYS, ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT, TUESDAY, OCTOBER 7, 2025. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNING IN EFFECT:	<i>There are currently no public warnings in effect.</i>
GENERAL SITUATION:	<p>A weak stationary front remains draped across the area, resulting in a mix of sunshine and periods of cloudiness this afternoon, along with isolated showers and thunderstorms. By tonight, this boundary is anticipated to weaken further, transitioning into a weak trough/shearline, before gradually dissipating overnight.</p> <p>Outlook: Weak high pressure is expected to briefly reestablish itself over the region on Wednesday into early Thursday, supporting generally stable conditions. However, lingering moisture coupled with a weak mid-level disturbance may trigger a few spotty showers and isolated afternoon thunderstorms. By Friday, a developing low-pressure system near the Florida Straits will gradually drag a cold front southward toward the Northern Islands. This front is forecast to bring increased moisture and instability, resulting in unsettled weather conditions across the northern half of the country that may persist into the National Heroes Day holiday weekend. In the wake of the front, expect slightly cooler temperatures in the Northern Bahamas, especially during the early mornings and late-night hours.</p> <p>Tropical Disturbance AL95 is expected to become a depression or named storm (Jerry) later today or tomorrow, before intensifying well east of the Bahamas, moving across the sub-tropical Atlantic by this weekend. No direct impacts to the Bahamas are anticipated at this time. Please see the Tropical Weather Outlook for more information.</p>
SPECIAL WEATHER NOTES:	<p>Rip Currents: There remains a high risk of dangerous rip currents affecting all Atlantic and Atlantic exposed shorelines. Beachgoers and pleasure craft operators in these areas are urged to not venture into the waters until conditions improve beginning Wednesday.</p> <p>Coastal Threats: Motorists and road users along Atlantic and Atlantic-exposed shorelines are urged to exercise extreme caution while traversing eastern coastal roads, especially the Glass Window Bridge in Eleuthera, due to the presence of possible overtopping waves and sea spray. Minor coastal flooding and possible erosion is possible in these areas, especially during periods of high tide.</p>

SKY CONDITIONS:	Variably cloudy this afternoon, becoming mostly fair tonight.		
PRECIPITATION:	20 – 40% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms this afternoon, decreasing to a 10 – 20% chance later tonight.		
WINDS:	East-northeast to east at 15 - 20 knots, decreasing to 10 - 15 knots tonight.

SKY CONDITIONS:	Mix of sun and clouds this afternoon, becoming mostly fair tonight.		
PRECIPITATION:	30 – 40% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms this afternoon, decreasing to a 10 – 20% chance later tonight.		
WINDS:	East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots.

SKY CONDITIONS:	Partly cloudy to occasionally cloudy this afternoon, becoming mostly fair tonight.		
PRECIPITATION:	30 – 40% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms this afternoon, decreasing to a 20% chance of showers tonight.		
WINDS:	East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times.

SKY CONDITIONS:	Partly sunny this afternoon, becoming partly cloudy tonight.		
PRECIPITATION:	20% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms this afternoon through tonight.		
WINDS:	East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:	There are currently two (2) areas of interest in the Atlantic:
	<div>1) Central Tropical Atlantic (AL95): An area of low pressure located about 1500 miles east of the Windward Islands is becoming better defined. This system has a high, or 90 percent chance of tropical cyclone formation within the next 48 hours. A tropical depression or storm may form later today or tomorrow, as the system moves swiftly westwards towards the northern Leeward Islands. The Bahamas Department of Meteorology will continue to monitor this system for further development.</div> <div>2) Southwestern Gulf: A trough of low pressure located near the Yucatan Peninsula is expected to emerge over the Bay of Campeche today. This system has a low, or 10 percent chance of tropical development through the next 48 hours and through seven (7) days.</div>

SKY CONDITIONS:	Northwest and Central Bahamas: Partly cloudy. Northern and Southeast Bahamas: A mix of sun and clouds, turning mostly fair at night.		
PRECIPITATION:	Northwest and Central Bahamas: 30 – 50% chance of showers with thunderstorms. Northern and Southeast Bahamas: 10 – 30% chance of showers with possible thunderstorms.		
WINDS:	Northern Bahamas: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots but gusty at times. Northwest, Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, decreasing 10 knots or less by the late afternoon.

PRECIPITATION:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 20 – 40% chance of showers with thunderstorms. Central and Southeast Bahamas: 10 – 30% chance of showers with possible thunderstorms.		
WINDS:	All areas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times, shifting northeast to east at 10 knots or less at night.

SKY CONDITIONS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Cloudy to overcast. Central and Southeast Bahamas: Partly sunny, turning fair to partly cloudy at night.		
PRECIPITATION:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 50 – 80% chance of showers with thunderstorms. Severe weather possible. Central and Southeast Bahamas: 10 – 30% chance of showers with possible thunderstorms.		
WINDS:	All areas: Variable at 10 knots or less. Expect gusty winds in heavy showers and thunderstorms in the Northern and Northwest Bahamas.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR Saturday 11 th October 2025:			
SKY CONDITIONS:	Northern Bahamas: Cloudy to overcast at first, becoming partly cloudy by the evening. Expect mostly fair conditions by nightfall. Northwest and Central Bahamas: Cloudy to overcast. Southeast Bahamas: Partly sunny, becoming partly cloudy at night.		
PRECIPITATION:	Northern Bahamas: 40 – 60% chance of showers with thunderstorms for the first half of the day, decreasing to a 20 – 30% chance of showers by nightfall. Severe weather is possible during the early morning hours. Northwest and Central Bahamas: 40 – 60% chance of showers with thunderstorms. Severe weather possible. Southeast Bahamas: 10 – 30% chance of showers.		
WINDS:	All areas: Variable at 10 knots or less at first, veering southwest to west at 10 knots or less by late morning/early afternoon. Expect gusty winds in heavy showers and thunderstorms in the Northern and Northwest Bahamas.

PRECIPITATION:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 10 – 30% chance of showers. Central and Southeast Bahamas: 20 – 40% chance of showers with thunderstorms.		
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Southwest to west at 10 to 15 knots ahead of the front, veering north to northeast at 10 to 15 knots behind the front. Central and Southeast Bahamas: South-southwest to west-southwest at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times.

PRECIPITATION:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 10 – 30% chance of showers. Central and Southeast Bahamas: 30 – 50% chance of showers with thunderstorms.		
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: North-northeast to east-northeast at 10 to 15 knots, increasing to 15 knots by nightfall. Central and Southeast Bahamas: South-southeast to south-southwest at 10 knots or less, shifting east to southeast at 10 to 15 knots by nightfall.
