## **BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST**

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Friday, July 18, 2025. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS:	A Near Gale warning is in effect for the territorial waters of Inagua.  Rip Currents: There is a moderate to high risk of rip currents affecting all eastern, southern and Atlantic beaches. Beachgoers in the Central and Southeast Bahamas are urged to remain onshore, and should exercise extreme caution in the Northern and Northwest Bahamas in these areas.
GENERAL SITUATION:	A high pressure ridge remains across the islands promoting mostly fresh to strong breezes through the weekend. A thin layer of Saharan Dust will move into the Southeastern islands later today producing hazy skies. Streaming moisture combined with mid to upper level troughing, will support a few isolated showers across the island chain. Expect typical summertime weather over the archipelago into early next week.
