



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Friday, August 8, 2025. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS:	<i>Severe Weather:</i> For the Northern and Northwest Bahamas, some showers could become heavy and thunderstorms strong to severe at times, therefore the public is urged to remain alert for any severe weather updates today. There is a risk of flooding in low lying or flood prone areas, please take the necessary precautions.
GENERAL SITUATION:	Deep layered troughing moving westward across the island chain will produce some convective activity through the weekend. Most of the showers and thunderstorms will be concentrated across the Northern and Northwestern Bahamas, with residual showers in the Central and parts of the Southeastern islands. A weak pressure gradient continues to support light to moderate breezes. <i>Outlook:</i> Weak high pressure is expected across the area as the surface trough moves away resulting in reduced shower activity by Sunday. However, mid to upper-level troughing will remain through early next week supporting occasional shower and thunderstorm activity.

ADVISORY:	No advisories
WINDS:	Southeasterly at 10 to 15 knots across all areas.
SEAS:	2 to 4 feet
WEATHER:	20-30% chance of showers with thunderstorms in the Northern and Northwest Bahamas and 10-20% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms in the Central and Southeast Bahamas.

WINDS:	East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with occasional gusts across all areas.
SEAS:	2 to 4 feet
WEATHER:	10 to 20% chance of isolated showers with possible afternoon thunderstorms.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:	<p>1. Off the Southeastern United States: A non-tropical area of low pressure located a few hundred miles off the coast of North Carolina has a low near 10 percent formation chance through 48 hours. Formation chance through 7 days is a low 20 percent.</p> <p>2. Central Tropical Atlantic (AL96): A tropical wave over the central Tropical Atlantic is in an environment that is forecasted to become conducive for gradual development in a few days. The wave has a low 10 percent chance of formation over the next 48 hours and a medium 60 percent chance through the next 7 days.</p>
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
