



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Saturday, June 6, 2026. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

*A **Severe Weather Watch** is now in effect for the area waters of the Southeast Bahamas and the Turks and Caicos Islands. Mariners are urged to remain updated on all severe weather warnings issued by the Bahamas Department of Meteorology, and should prepare to seek safe harbour once conditions worsen.*

WARNINGS:

Rip Currents: There is a *slight* to *moderate* risk of rip currents affecting all Atlantic exposures of the Bahamas. *Beachgoers and swimmers are urged to exercise caution.*

Heavy showers, strong thunderstorms and gusty winds supported by a weakening frontal boundary and an upper level low over the Bahamas can lead to high seas and choppy conditions for mariners mainly across portions of the Central and Southeast Bahamas throughout the day. Elsewhere, outside of shower activity, relatively benign seafaring conditions are expected due to a mostly moderate wind regime and a dry air mass blanketing the northern territories.

GENERAL SITUATION:

Outlook: Sunday through midweek, scattered showers will affect much of the Bahamas as a weakening frontal boundary dissipates. Heavier showers and isolated thunderstorms are expected mainly across southern waters. Northern waters will remain under a drier and more stable air mass, supporting generally fair conditions with only brief passing showers.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY:	A small craft caution is in effect for Atlantic waters.
WINDS:	East-northeast to east-southeast at 10 to 15 knots.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 feet or less in sheltered nearshore waters. 2 to 4 feet in sheltered offshore waters. 3 to 5 feet in the Gulf Stream. 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	10% chance of showers.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY:	A small craft caution is in effect for Atlantic waters.
WINDS:	Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 feet or less in sheltered nearshore waters. 2 to 4 feet in sheltered offshore waters. 3 to 5 feet in the NW Providence Channel. 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	10 – 30% chance of showers.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY:	A small craft caution is in effect for Atlantic waters. <i>Expect gusty winds and higher seas in or near heavy showers and thunderstorms.</i>
WINDS:	East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 feet or less in sheltered nearshore waters. 2 to 4 feet in sheltered offshore waters. 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	30 – 50% chance of showers with thunderstorms today, decreasing to a 20 – 30% chance tonight.

**SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS**

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY:	A small craft caution is in effect for Atlantic waters. <i>Expect gusty winds and higher seas in or near heavy showers and thunderstorms.</i>
WINDS:	Easterly at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times today, veering southeast at 15 knots tonight.
LOCAL SEAS:	1 to 3 feet in sheltered nearshore waters. 2 to 4 feet in sheltered offshore waters. 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	40 – 70% chance of showers with thunderstorms.

ADVISORY:	<i>None.</i>
WINDS:	Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts. Southeast Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times during the day, shifting east to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts.
SEAS:	All areas: 1 to 3 feet in sheltered nearshore waters. 2 to 4 feet in sheltered offshore waters. 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	Northern Bahamas: 10 – 20% chance of showers. Northwest, Central and Southeast Bahamas: 20 – 40% chance of showers with possible thunderstorms.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR MONDAY 8TH JUNE 2026:

ADVISORY:	<i>None.</i>
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: East-southeast to south-southeast at 10 knots or less, increasing 10 to 15 knots by nightfall. Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 knots with higher gusts.
SEAS:	Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters. Southeast Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	All areas: 20 – 30% chance of showers with possible afternoon thunderstorms.
