MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Thursday, October 23, 2025. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

	Small craft advisory for Atlantic exposed waters in the Southeast Bahamas.		
WARNINGS:	Severe Thunderstorm Risk: There is a marginal threat of a few isolated strong to possible severe		
	thunderstorms across the Southeast Bahamas.		
	Rip currents: There is a moderate to high risk of rip currents along east-coast facing shorelines in		
	the Southeast & Central Bahamas.		
	A near gale (28-33kt) watch is in effect for the waters south of Inagua, including the Windward		
	Passage, in the Southeast Bahamas.		
	Scattered showers and widespread rain along with isolated thunderstorms fueled by rich tropical		
	moisture streaming from Tropical Storm Melissa, will prevail across the Southeast Bahamas and		
	portions of the Central Islands through tonight.		
GENERAL	Over the northern Bahamas, shower chances remain relatively low as high pressure and a drier air		
SITUATION:	mass dominate the area. However, a few isolated showers may develop across the northwest		
	Bahamas due to weak surface troughing nearby.		
	Winds will be moderate to fresh across the northern half of the country and fresh to occasionally		
	strong over the remaining islands. Seas will be slight to moderate nearshore for most of the country,		
	but moderate to rough in Atlantic-exposed waters of the Southeastern Islands.		

NORTHERN BAHAMAS (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):			
ADVISORY:	None.		
WINDS:	Northeast to east at $10 - \frac{15}{10}$ knots.		
LOCAL SEAS: 2 – 4 feet nearshore, building up to 5 - 6 feet in offshore and Atlantic waters.			
GULF STREAM:	3 – 5 feet; northwest to north at 15 knots; light northeast to east swell.		
SWELLS:	Light northeast to east swell on Atlantic exposed waters.		
WEATHER:	10 – 20% chance of an isolated shower or two.		

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NORTHWEST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):			
ADVISORY: Small craft caution for Atlantic waters.			
WINDS:	Northeast to east at $10 - 15$ knots, increasing to $15 - 20$ knots by the afternoon.		
LOCAL SEAS:	2 – 4 feet nearshore, building up to 5 - 6 feet in offshore and Atlantic waters.		
SWELLS:	Light northeast to east swell on Atlantic exposed waters.		
WEATHER:	30% chance of isolated showers or thunderstorms.		

CENTRAL BAHAMAS (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY:	Small craft caution for ALL area waters.	
WINDS:	East-northeasterly at $15-20$ knots.	
LOCAL SEAS:	2 – 4 feet nearshore, building up to 5 - 7 feet in offshore and Atlantic waters.	
SWELLS:	Light easterly swell on Atlantic exposed waters.	
WEATHER:	30 – 40% chance of widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms.	



SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY:	Small craft advisory.	
WINDS:	Easterly at 15 – 25 knots.	
LOCAL SEAS:	3 – 5 feet nearshore, building up to 6 - 8 feet in offshore and Atlantic waters.	
SWELLS: Light to moderate easterly swell on Atlantic exposed waters.		
WEATHER:	50 – 70% chance of scattered showers and widely scattered thunderstorms.
