



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Thursday, June 11, 2026. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS: *Rip Currents: A slight risk of rip currents exists along Atlantic-exposed beaches of the island chain. Beachgoers should exercise caution when entering the water.*

The combination of a dry airmass and high pressure ridging will continue to produce light to gentle easterly winds and flat seas across The Bahamas through tonight.

GENERAL SITUATION: **Outlook:** Favorable marine conditions will persist into Friday. On Saturday afternoon/evening, a tropical wave and its associated moisture, is expected to lift northward from the Caribbean sea increasing shower and thunderstorm chances over the southern half of the country. Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in or near showers and thunderstorms.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*
WINDS: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.
GULF STREAM: 1 to 2 feet.
SWELLS: Slight northeasterly swells over Atlantic-exposed waters.
WEATHER: 10-20% chance of showers.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*
WINDS: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.
SWELLS: No significant swells.
WEATHER: 10-20% chance of showers.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*
WINDS: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.
SWELLS: No significant swells.
WEATHER: 10-20% chance of showers.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*
WINDS: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.
SWELLS: No significant swells.
WEATHER: 10-20% chance of showers.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY 12TH JUNE, 2026.

WINDS:	Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: East-northeast to east-southeast at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times. Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts at night.
SEAS:	All Areas: 2 feet or less in nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 3 feet or less in Atlantic exposed waters.
WEATHER:	All Areas: 10 -20% chance of quick passing showers.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SATURDAY 13TH JUNE, 2026.

WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times. Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts.
SEAS:	Northern, Northwest & Central Bahamas: 2 feet or less in nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 3 feet or less in Atlantic-exposed waters. Southeast Bahamas: 2 feet or less in nearshore and offshore sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.
WEATHER:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 10 - 20% chance of showers. Central and Southeast Bahamas: 20 - 30% chance of showers.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:

A broad area of low pressure could form over the Bay of Campeche on Friday from a westward moving-tropical wave currently located over the northwestern Caribbean Sea. . This system would have a **low, or 10% chance of tropical cyclone development within the next seven (7) days**, as it moves inland over eastern Mexico late this weekend.

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
