



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, TuesTuesday, July 1, 2025. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS:	 Severe Weather: There is a likelihood of isolated occurrences of severe weather (including hail, strong winds and waterspouts) across portions of the Northern and Northwest Bahamas today. Boaters are urged to remain updated of all severe watches and warnings issued by the Bahamas Department of Meteorology. Rip currents: Beachgoers and swimmers should exercise extreme caution along east coast beaches and Atlantic exposures in the Central and Southeast Bahamas.
GENERAL	An upper level low will remain stationary just northeast of the area, while extending a trough across the northern territories. This feature will interact with ample tropical moisture, generating occasional showers and thunderstorms across area waters of the Northern and Northwest Bahamas. Elsewhere, deep layered ridging will continue to build westwards, as the surface high supports fresh to occasionally strong winds and higher seas across the Central and Southeast Bahamas.
SITUATION:	Outlook: Expect the state of the sea across all areas to persist due to the relatively consistent wind regime. Lingering troughing and moisture will continue to support occasional bursts of heavy showers and thunderstorms across portions of the Northern and Northwest Bahamas through to late Wednesday.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY: None. Expect gusty winds and higher seas in or near heavy showers and thunderstorms.		
WINDS: Southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots, becoming gusty at times.		
LOCAL SEAS:	Calm to 1 feet in sheltered nearshore waters. 1 to 3 feet in sheltered offshore waters and the Gulf Stream. 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.	
SWELLS:	Light northeast to east swells affecting Atlantic waters.	
WEATHER:	30 - 50% chance of showers with thunderstorms today, decreasing to a 10 - 20% chance tonight.	

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY: None. Expect gusty winds and higher seas in or near heavy showers and thunderstorms.		
WINDS:	East-southeast to south-southeast at 15 knots, becoming gusty at times.	
LOCAL SEAS:	1 to 2 feet in sheltered nearshore waters. 2 to 4 feet in sheltered offshore waters. 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.	
SWELLS:	Light northeasterly swells affecting Atlantic waters.	
WEATHER:	20 - 30% chance of showers with thunderstorms today, decreasing to a 10 - 20% chance tonight.	

CENTRAL BAHAMAS (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY:	A small craft caution is in effect.	
WINDS:	East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots.	
LOCAL SEAS:	1 to 3 feet in sheltered nearshore waters. 3 to 5 feet in sheltered offshore waters. 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic waters.	
SWELLS:	Light northeasterly swells affecting Atlantic waters.	
WEATHER:	10% chance of showers with a slight chance of an afternoon thunderstorm.	

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY:	A small craft advisory is in effect for the waters south of Inagua. A small craft caution is in effect elsewhere.	
WINDS:	East to southeast at 15 to 25 knots.	
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet in sheltered nearshore waters. 4 to 6 feet in sheltered offshore and Atlantic waters. 5 to 8 feet in area waters south of Inagua.	
SWELLS:	Light northeasterly swells affecting Atlantic waters.	
WEATHER:	10% chance of showers.

ADVISORY: A small craft advisory remains in effect for the waters of Inagua. A small craft caution remains in effect for the Central and the remainder of the Southeast Bahamas.		
WINDS:Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots. Central Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots. Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 15 to 25 knots.		
SEAS:	1 to 3 feet in nearshore sheltered waters. 2 to 4 feet in sheltered offshore waters of the Northern and Northwest Bahamas. 4 to 6 feet in sheltered offshore waters of the Central and Southeast Bahamas, as well as all Atlantic exposures. 5 to 8 feet in offshore waters south of Inagua.	
WEATHER:	20 - 40% chance of showers with thunderstorms in the Northern and Northwest Bahamas. 10 - 20% chance of showers across the remainder of the islands.

SEAS:			1 to 3 feet in nearshore sheltered waters. 2 to 4 feet in sheltered offshore waters of the Northern and Northwest Bahamas. 4 to 6 feet in sheltered offshore waters of the Central and Southeast Bahamas, as well as all Atlantic exposures. 5 to 8 feet in offshore waters south of Inagua.	
WEATHER:			20 - 30% chance of showers with a few thunderstorms in the Northern Bahamas. 10% chance of showers elsewhere.
