MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Tuesday, September 16, 2025. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS:	<i>There are currently no public warnings in effect.</i>
GENERAL SITUATION:	<p>Weak troughing along with abundant tropical moisture will maintain the likelihood of isolated showers or thunderstorms over the northern portions of the country today. Meanwhile, gentle to moderate breezes and seas will prevail as high pressure dominates elsewhere.</p> <p>Outlook: A shift to a more unsettled pattern is expected by midweek over the Northern and Northwestern Bahamas due to a combination of deep-layered troughing and tropical moisture, supporting cloudy skies with scattered showers and thunderstorms through the end of the work week. Additionally, by the end of the work week, the northern extent of a tropical wave along with an approaching mid to upper-level low will increase shower and thunderstorm chances across the Southeastern Islands into the weekend.</p>

WINDS:	Northeast to east at 10 knots, falling light and variable at times.
LOCAL SEAS:	3 feet or less.
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters.
WEATHER:	Isolated showers or thunderstorms.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

WINDS:	Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet.
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters.
WEATHER:	Isolated showers or thunderstorms.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

WINDS:	Easterly at 15 to 20 knots.
LOCAL SEAS:	3 to 5 feet.
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters.
WEATHER:	Isolated showers or thunderstorms.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR Wednesday 17 th September 2025	
ADVISORY:	<i>Small craft should exercise caution in the Southeast Bahamas.</i>
WINDS:	Northern & Northwest Bahamas: Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots, gusty at times. Central Bahamas: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots, gusty at times. Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 15 to 20 knots, gusty at times.
SEAS:	Northern, Northwest Bahamas & Central Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet. Southeast Bahamas: 3 to 5 feet.
WEATHER:	Northern & Northwest Bahamas: Scattered showers and thunderstorms. Central Bahamas: Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms. Southeast Bahamas: Isolated showers or thunderstorms.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR Thursday 18 th September 2025	
ADVISORY:	<i>Small craft should exercise caution in the Southeast Bahamas.</i>
WINDS:	Northern & Northwest Bahamas: Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots. Central Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots. Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 15 to 20 knots, with higher gusts.
SEAS:	Northern, Northwest Bahamas & Central Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet. Southeast Bahamas: 3 to 5 feet.
WEATHER:	Northern & Northwest Bahamas: Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms. Central & Southeast Bahamas: Isolated showers and thunderstorms.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:	Two areas are currently being monitored: 1. Central Tropical Atlantic (AL92): A large area of showers and thunderstorms continues to show signs of organization midway between the Windward Islands and the coast of west Africa. Environmental conditions are conducive for further development, and a tropical depression or storm is likely to form in the next day or two. Formation chance through 7 days...high...90 percent. 2. Eastern Tropical Atlantic: A tropical wave emerging off the west coast of Africa is producing an area of disorganized showers and thunderstorms. Some slow development of this system is possible towards the mid to latter part of this week. Formation chance through 7 days...low...20 percent.
