



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Wednesday, April 29, 2026. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS:	<i>Rip Currents:</i> A moderate risk of rip currents exists along Atlantic-exposed beaches of the island chain. <i>Beachgoers are advised to exercise caution.</i>
GENERAL SITUATION:	<p>High pressure north of the area, will continue to support light to fresh breezes across the island chain and mostly stable, and warm temperatures. However, some light passing showers are possible due to a weakening frontal boundary just east of the Central Bahamas. That front is expected to dissipate later today.</p> <p><i>Outlook:</i> High pressure is expected to remain across the area through late Thursday or early Friday when a front will move near the Northern Bahamas producing some shower activity across that area. That frontal boundary is expected to stall just north of the area. However on Sunday, another stronger front is expected to slide into the Northern islands producing widespread showers and thunderstorms. This wet weather pattern will spread into the Northwest Bahamas through Monday, and the Central islands by Tuesday as the front moves southeastward.</p>

NORTHERN BAHAMAS (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):	
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ADVISORY:	<i>Small craft caution for Atlantic shores</i>
WINDS:	East to southeast at 10 knots or less, occasionally falling light and variable
LOCAL SEAS:	1 to 3 feet in sheltered waters, 3 to 5 feet on Atlantic waters.
GULF STREAM:	2 to 3 feet
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	10 to 20% chance of showers.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):	
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ADVISORY:	<i>Small craft caution for Atlantic shores</i>
WINDS:	East to southeast at 10 knots or less, occasionally falling light and variable
LOCAL SEAS:	1 to 3 feet in sheltered waters, 3 to 5 feet on Atlantic waters.
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	10 to 20% chance of showers.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):	
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ADVISORY:	None
WINDS:	East-northeast to east-southeast at 10 to 15 knots.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 3 feet in sheltered waters, 3 to 4 feet along Atlantic waters
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	10 to 20% chance of showers.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):	
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ADVISORY:	None
WINDS:	Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots increasing to 15 knots with higher gusts by evening.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 3 feet in sheltered waters, 3 to 4 feet along Atlantic waters
SWELLS:	Light north to northeast swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	10 to 20% chance of showers.

ADVISORY:	None
WINDS:	Northern Bahamas: South to southwest at 10 to 15 knots, with higher gusts during the evening hours. Northwest Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 knots or less Central and Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times across the Central Bahamas.
SEAS:	Northern, Central and Southeast Bahamas: 2 to 3 feet in sheltered areas Northwest Bahamas: 1 to 3 feet in sheltered areas 3 to 4 feet for Atlantic waters
WEATHER:	10 to 20% chance of showers.

ADVISORY:	None
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: South to southwest at 10 knots or less, becoming southeast to south at 10 knots or less with higher gusts. Central Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 knots or less Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots
SEAS:	Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: 1 to 3 feet in sheltered waters Southeast Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet in sheltered waters 3 to 4 feet along Atlantic waters
WEATHER:	Northern Bahamas: 10 to 30% chance of showers or an isolated thunderstorm. Elsewhere: 10 to 20% chance of showers.

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
