



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EST, Wednesday, December 3, 2025. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EST.

WARNINGS:	There is a <i>marginal to moderate</i> risk of early morning patches of fog along forested, marshy and coastal areas, therefore the public is advised to exercise caution when traversing these areas. There is a <i>moderate</i> risk of rip currents along all Atlantic coastal beaches, hence beachgoers and swimmers are asked to remain vigilant.
GENERAL SITUATION:	Troughing, associated with an approaching cold front near the Northern Bahama Islands along with a surface trough coupled with low level moisture east of the southern islands will generate some shallow shower activity across portions of the country. Outlook: The front is anticipated to stall across the Central Bahama islands and gradually dissipate through Thursday. High pressure will then rebuild over most of the country for the remainder of the week, maintaining stable and mostly dry conditions. Nonetheless, persistent low-level troughing near the Southeast Bahamas will keep the chance of a few spotty showers in place through the end of the work week.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):	
ADVISORY:	<i>None.</i>
WINDS:	Northwest to north at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet near shore but up to 5 feet along Atlantic exposures.
GULF STREAM:	1 to 2 feet over the ocean.
SWELLS:	Light easterly swells.
WEATHER:	10-20% chance of showers mainly near the frontal boundary.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):	
ADVISORY:	<i>None.</i>
WINDS:	Southwest to west at 10 to 15 knots, shifting Northwest to north by tonight.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet near shore but up to 5 feet along Atlantic exposures.
SWELLS:	Light easterly swells.
WEATHER:	10-20% chance of showers mainly near the frontal boundary.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):	
ADVISORY:	<i>Small craft operators should exercise caution in Atlantic waters.</i>
WINDS:	Light and variable at 10 knots or less.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet near shore but up to 5 feet along Atlantic exposures.
SWELLS:	Light to moderate easterly swells.
WEATHER:	10% chance of showers.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):	
ADVISORY:	<i>A small craft caution comes into effect tonight.</i>
WINDS:	Northeasterly at 10 to 15 knots increasing to 15 knots with higher gusts by tonight.
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet near shore but up to 5 feet along Atlantic exposures. Building 4 to 6 feet tonight.
SWELLS:	Light to moderate easterly swells.
WEATHER:	20% chance of showers.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THURSDAY 4 TH DECEMBER, 2025:	
ADVISORY:	<i>A small craft caution will be in effect for the Southeast Bahamas and the Atlantic waters for the Central Bahamas.</i>
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: North to northeast at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times. Central Bahamas: Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times. Southeast Bahamas: Northeast to east at 15 knots with higher gusts.
SEAS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet. Central Bahamas: 3 to 5 feet Southeast Bahamas: 3 to 5 feet but up to 6 feet along Atlantic waters.
WEATHER:	10 to 20% chance of isolated showers across the Southeastern Bahamas with a 10% or less chance elsewhere.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY 5 TH DECEMBER, 2025:	
ADVISORY:	<i>A small craft caution will be in effect for the Central and Southeast Bahamas.</i>
WINDS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable. Shifting southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots across the Northern Bahamas but 10 knots or less across the Northwest Bahamas. Central and Southeast Bahamas: Northeast to east at 15 to 20 knots.
SEAS:	Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet over the ocean. Central and Southeast Bahamas: 4 to 6 feet over the ocean.
WEATHER:	20% chance of showers across the Southeastern Bahamas. Elsewhere, 10% or less chance of showers.

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
