BAHAMAS PUBLIC FORECAST

FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR TODAY, TONIGHT AND THE NEXT SIX (6) DAYS, ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Tuesday, July 1, 2025. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNING IN EFFECT:	There are currently no warnings in effect at this time.
GENERAL SITUATION:	An upper level-low will remain stationary just northeast of the area, while extending a trough across the northern territories. This feature will interact with ample tropical moisture, generating occasional showers and thunderstorms throughout the day. Elsewhere, deep layered ridging will continue to build westwards, supporting a plume of Saharan dust that will act to suppress significant shower activity through tonight. Outlook: Lingering troughing and moisture will continue to support occasional bursts of heavy showers and thunderstorms across portions of the Northern and Northwest Bahamas through to late Wednesday. Building high pressure will produce increasingly drier and stable conditions, as the Saharan dust plume eventually thins out across the area by the weekend. Area of interest: A frontal boundary will descend across Florida over the next few days before stalling and weakening on Friday, trapping cloudiness and relatively higher shower and thunderstorm chances across the northern regions by the end of the week. SPECIAL WEATHER NOTES:	Severe Weather: There is a likelihood of isolated occurrences of severe weather (including hail, strong winds and funnel clouds) across portions of the Northern and Northwest Bahamas today. The public is urged to remain updated of all severe watches and warnings issued by the Bahamas Department of Meteorology. Flooding: Residents in the Northern and Northwest Bahamas are urged to exercise caution during and after heavy rainfall events, due to the high risk of flooding in low-lying, flood-prone and urban areas. Heat/UV Indices: The public is advised to remain hydrated, wear loose-fitted clothing and sunscreen while outdoors, and take frequent breaks during peak sunshine hours, as UV indices are expected in the high to very high range and heat indices will reach the mid-90's to the lower triple digits. Rip currents: Beachgoers and swimmers should exercise extreme caution along east coast beaches and Atlantic exposures in the Central and Southeast Bahamas.

Near the Southeastern U.S.: A frontal boundary is expected to stall and weaken off of the southeast U.S. coast late this week. As a result, an area of low pressure could develop near or across Florida by this weekend. This system has a **near zero** percent chance of development within the next 48 hours, and a low, or 20 percent chance of tropical cyclone formation through the next seven days.
