



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EST SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 8TH, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EST.

Gale (34-40 knots) watch comes into effect at noon on Monday for the Northern and Northwest Bahamas, and at 6 pm for the Central Bahamas.

WARNINGS: **Rip Currents:** Beachgoers and swimmers across all areas should NOT enter Atlantic facing coastal waters due to a **MODERATE** risk of rip currents.

Coastal Flooding: Due to the full moon, residents should be alert for flooding along banks, marshes and coastal areas during high tide.

GENERAL SITUATION: High pressure centered northeast of the area will maintain dry and stable conditions across the island chain through the remainder of the weekend. A strong cold front is expected to enter the Northern Bahamas around midday Monday and race southeastwards leaving dangerous marine conditions in its wake.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS
(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*
WINDS: East to southeast at 10 knots or less tonight, becoming south to southwest at 10 knots or less tomorrow.
LOCAL SEAS: 2 feet or less nearshore, 2 to 3 feet offshore, and in Atlantic waters.
GULF STREAM: Up to 2 feet.
SWELLS: Slight easterly swells.
WEATHER: 10-20% chance of an isolated shower or two.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS
(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*
WINDS: Light and variable tonight, becoming southeast to south at 10 knots or less tonight.
LOCAL SEAS: 2 feet or less nearshore, 2 to 3 feet offshore, and in Atlantic waters.
SWELLS: Slight easterly swells.
WEATHER: 10-20% chance of isolated showers or thunderstorms.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS
(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *None.*
WINDS: Northeast to east at 10 knots or less tonight, becoming southeasterly at 10 knots or less tomorrow.
LOCAL SEAS: 2 feet or less nearshore, 2 to 4 feet offshore, and in Atlantic waters.
SWELLS: Slight northeast and easterly swells.
WEATHER: 10-20% chance of an isolated shower or two.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS
(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: *Small craft caution in effect for Atlantic exposed waters.*
WINDS: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, higher in gusts.
LOCAL SEAS: 2 feet or less nearshore, 2 to 4 feet offshore and 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic waters.
SWELLS: Slight to moderate northeast and easterly swells.
WEATHER: 10-20% chance of an isolated shower or two.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:

Tropical cyclone formation is not expected during the next 7 days.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10TH, 2025:

ADVISORY:	Small craft caution in effect for the Northern Bahamas with a small craft advisory coming into effect at Noon. A small craft advisory comes into effect for the Northwest Bahamas at Noon and 6 pm for the Central Bahamas.
WINDS:	Northern Bahamas: Southwest to west at 10 to 15 knots, becoming west to northwest at 20 to 25 knots, with higher gusts by afternoon. Northwest Bahamas: South to southwest at 10 to 15 knots, becoming west to northwest at 20 to 25 knots, with higher gusts by afternoon. Central Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 knots or less during the day, becoming northwest to north at 10 to 15 knots up to midnight, and increasing to 15 to 25 knots, with gusts to gale force possible after midnight. Southeast Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 knots or less up to midnight, becoming west to northwest at 10 to 15 knots after midnight.
SEAS:	Northern & Northwest Bahamas: 2 to 4 nearshore sheltered waters, 4 to 6 feet offshore sheltered waters, and building to 6 to 10 feet in Atlantic waters. Central & Southeast Bahamas: 2 feet or less nearshore sheltered waters, 2 to 3 feet offshore sheltered waters, and 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters but 5 to 7 feet in the Central Bahamas.
SWELLS:	Moderate to large easterly swells.
WEATHER:	Northern & Northwest Bahamas: 20-30% chance of showers and thunderstorms. Central & Southeast Bahamas: 10-20% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 11TH, 2025:

ADVISORY:	A Gale Watch is in effect. Boaters, especially small craft, are urged to remain in ports. Northern Bahamas: Northerly at 20 to 25 knots, with gusts to gale force possible during the day; north to northeast at 15 to 20 knots up to midnight, and northeasterly at 10 to 15 knots after midnight.
WINDS:	Northwest Bahamas: Northerly at 20 to 25 knots during the day, becoming northeasterly at 15 to 20 knots at night. Central & Southeast Bahamas: Northerly at 20 to 30 knots, with gusts to gale force possible during the day; north to northeast at 15 to 25 knots in the Central Bahamas and 20 to 30 knots in the Southeast Bahamas.
SEAS:	All Areas: 3 to 5 nearshore sheltered waters, 5 to 7 feet offshore sheltered waters, and building to 8 to 12 feet in Atlantic waters.
SWELLS:	Moderate to large northwest and northerly swells.
WEATHER:	Northern & Northwest Bahamas: 10-20% chance of isolated showers. Central & Southeast Bahamas: 20-30% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms.
