



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EST SUNDAY, 7TH JUNE, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EST TOMORROW.

WARNINGS:

There is a *slight to moderate risk* of rip currents on the Atlantic waters of The Bahamas. *Beachgoers and swimmers visiting beaches in these areas are urged to exercise caution.*

GENERAL SITUATION:

Deep-layered trough across the Central Bahamas continues to generate showers and possible thunderstorm activity over the Southeast Bahamas. Meanwhile, ridging over the Northern and Northwest islands will maintain drier, more stable conditions. These conditions are expected to persist until Wednesday.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

ADVISORY:

WINDS:

East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots falling light and variable at times through tomorrow.

LOCAL SEAS:

3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters through tomorrow.

GULF STREAM:

3 feet or less through tomorrow.

SWELLS:

Light easterly swells in Atlantic waters through tomorrow.

WEATHER:

Chance of isolated showers.

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

WINDS:

East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots falling light and variable at times through tomorrow.

LOCAL SEAS:

3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters through tomorrow.

SWELLS:

Light easterly swells in Atlantic waters through tomorrow.

WEATHER:

Chance of isolated showers.

East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts through tomorrow.

3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters through tomorrow.

WEATHER:

Chance of showers with possible isolated thunderstorms.

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY:

WINDS:

East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts through tomorrow.

LOCAL SEAS:

3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters through tomorrow.

SWELLS:

Light easterly swells in Atlantic waters through tomorrow.

WEATHER:

Chance of showers with possible isolated thunderstorms.

Elsewhere: 3 feet or less in nearshore, open waters and Atlantic waters.

PRECIPITATION: **All areas:** Isolated showers with the chance for a few isolated thunderstorms.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR WEDNESDAY, 10TH JUNE, 2026:

ADVISORY: *None.*

WINDS: **All areas:** Easterly at 10 knots or less.

SEAS: **Northeast Bahamas:** 3 feet or less in nearshore and open waters, 2 to 4 feet in Atlantic waters.
Elsewhere: 3 feet or less in nearshore, open waters and Atlantic waters.

PRECIPITATION: **All areas:** Isolated showers with the chance for a few isolated thunderstorms.
