BAHAMAS PUBLIC FORECAST FOR TONIGHT AND THE NEXT SIX (6) DAYS, ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EDT, Sunday, July 12, 2026. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECAST WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EDT TOMORROW.

WARNING EFFECT: **A Heat Advisory** remains in effect for the entire Bahamas. Residents and visitors are advised to remain hydrated, wear protective clothing, seek shaded areas and avoid prolonged sun exposure during peak sunshine hours (11am to 4pm).

IN EFFECT: **A Dust Advisory** remains in effect for all islands of the Bahamas, as well as the Turks & Caicos Islands. Residents, especially those with respiratory conditions, should take the necessary precautions to safeguard their health.

GENERAL SITUATION: The country remains under the influence of an expansive high pressure ridge accompanied by a plume of Saharan dust which will continue to promote mainly dry, hot, and hazy conditions along with moderate to fresh breezes. Meanwhile, weak low-level troughing and moisture just north of the Northern Bahamas may trigger a few isolated showers or thunderstorms across portions of that region by late tonight and possibly during Monday afternoon.

OUTLOOK: High pressure along with additional plumes of Saharan dust will remain dominant throughout much of the upcoming week, supporting hot, hazy, and generally stable conditions across the island chain while a weak front sags southward but lingers north of the area. This pattern will contribute to above-normal temperatures, slightly reduced air quality, and generally limited shower activity. Temperatures are expected to increase further during the latter part of the week, resulting in even hotter conditions.

RIP CURRENTS: There is a moderate risk of rip currents for the east and southeastern Atlantic coasts of the Central Bahamas, and all area waters of the Southeast Bahamas including the southern territorial waters. Swimmers are advised to exercise caution.

TIDAL LEVELS: Due to the approaching Super New Moon on Tuesday (14th July), there will be a marginal risk of tidal flooding along coastal and swamp areas, especially during the evening high tide hours starting today and continuing through to midweek.

UV INDEX: Members of the public are advised to wear protective clothing and sunscreen, and seek shaded areas while outside during peak sunshine hours (11am – 4pm), as UV indices are expected to be in the very high range.

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

SKY CONDITIONS:	Mainly fair at first, becoming partly cloudy to occasionally cloudy overnight, turning variably cloudy and hazy tomorrow.		
PRECIPITATION:	20 – 40% chance of widely scattered showers and a few isolated thunderstorms late tonight through the overnight hours, decreasing to a 10 – 30% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms by late Monday morning.		
WINDS:	South to southwest at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times.
