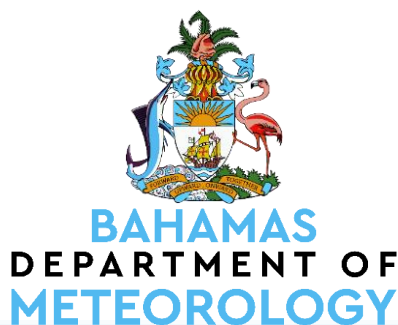

NEWS ITEM

NEWS ITEM ON **TROPICAL STORM HANNA**, ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY, FORECAST OFFICE SECTION, ON MONDAY 28TH, SEPTEMBER 2026 AT 6:00 PM EDT.

...HANNA FORECAST TO BE A SHORT LIVED TROPICAL STORM AS IT MOVES EASTWARD ACROSS THE CENTRAL SUBTROPICAL ATLANTIC...

AT 5:00 PM EDT, THE CENTER OF **TROPICAL STORM HANNA** WAS LOCATED NEAR **LATITUDE 36.5° NORTH AND LONGITUDE 48.7° WEST**, OR ABOUT **960 MILES EAST-NORTHEAST** OF BERMUDA.

HANNA IS MOVING TOWARD THE **EAST-SOUTHEAST** NEAR **17 MPH**. A GENERAL EAST-SOUTHEAST MOTION IS FORECAST OVER THE NEXT DAY OR TWO FOLLOWED BY A TURN TO THE EAST-NORTHEAST.

MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS ARE NEAR **45 MPH** (75 KM/H) WITH HIGHER GUSTS. ONLY SLIGHT INTENSIFICATION IS FORECAST IN THE SHORT-TERM AND **HANNA** IS LIKELY TO BECOME A POST-TROPICAL CYCLONE BY THE LATTER PART OF THIS WEEK.

THIS SYSTEM POSES NO THREAT TO THE BAHAMAS.
