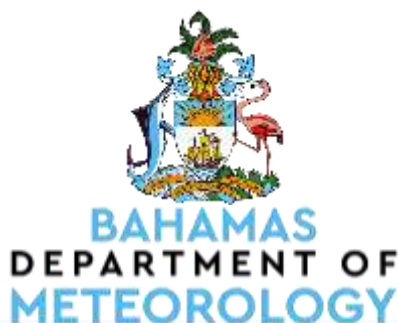

⚠ SEVERE WEATHER WARNING UPDATE ⚠

THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY HAS ISSUED A SEVERE WEATHER WARNING ON TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2026 FROM 9:30 AM EDT UNTIL 11:30 AM.

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING REMAINS IN EFFECT NORTH ANDROS, BIMINI AND THE BERRY ISLANDS ALONG WITH THE ADJACENT CAYS.

THE SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING HAS BEEN DISCONTINUED FOR ALL OTHER AREAS.

AT 9:20 AM EDT, OBSERVATION, RADAR AND SATELLITE IMAGERY CONTINUED TO DEPICT A LINE OF HEAVY SHOWERS WITH EMBEDDED THUNDERSTORM ACTIVITY MOVING OVER THE WARNING AREAS. THESE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS ARE ASSOCIATED WITH TROUGHING AND RESIDUAL MOISTURE.

SOME OF THESE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WILL BE SEVERE AT TIMES CAUSING STRONG GUSTY WINDS, DANGEROUS LIGHTNING, HEAVY DOWNPOURS, FLOODING, HAIL AND POSSIBLE WATERSPOUT OR TORNADIC ACTIVITY.

BOATERS IN THE WARNING AREAS SHOULD SEEK SAFE HARBOUR AND RESIDENTS IN THE WARNING AREA SHOULD STAY INDOORS AND AWAY FROM WINDOWS WHEN CONDITIONS WORSEN. RESIDENTS SHOULD NOT SEEK SHELTER UNDER TREES OR IN WATER AS THESE CAN BECOME LIGHTNING CONDUCTORS.
