



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 06:00 P.M. EDT, SUNDAY, 12TH OCTOBER 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 06:00 A.M. EDT TOMORROW.

Hazardous marine conditions across Atlantic-exposed waters subside briefly on Tuesday; however, swell will once again build in Atlantic waters on Wednesday. Therefore, mariners

and boaters are urged not to venture into Atlantic-exposed waters.

WARNINGS: There is a high risk of rip currents for the north and east coastal waters (including Atlantic

exposures) in the Northern and Northwest Bahamas; therefore, beachgoers and sea bathers are encouraged to remain on the shore. A **moderate** risk of rip currents is in place for south and east coastal waters in the Central and Southeast Bahamas; therefore, beachgoers and

swimmers are urged to exercise extreme caution.

A near-stationary frontal boundary oscillating across the Northern/Northwest Bahamas, along with an upper-level trough, supports an elevated threat of showers and thunderstorms through Tuesday. The frontal boundary pushes southeastward toward the Central/Southeast

GENERAL SITUATION: Bahamas late Tuesday into Wednesday as high pressure builds eastward over the southeast

United States. Drier conditions settle in after midweek; however, a weak reinforcing backdoor front sneaks through on Friday with little fanfare.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: A small craft advisory continues for Atlantic-exposed waters.

WINDS: North to northwest, 10 knots or less tonight; Northerly, 10 to 15 knots Monday morning and north

to northeast, 10 to 15 knots in the afternoon through night.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 feet or less in the near-shore sheltered waters, 2 to 4 feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 6 to 9

feet in Atlantic exposed waters tonight, 5 to 8 feet on Monday.

GULF STREAM: 5 to 7 feet tonight; 3 to 5 feet on Monday **SWELLS:** Moderate to light east to southeast swell

WEATHER: There is a low to medium chance (30%-40%) of isolated showers and thunderstorms

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: A small craft advisory continues for Atlantic-exposed waters.

Southwest to west, 10 to 15 knots ahead of the frontal boundary, but 15 to 20 knots in Atlantic

WINDS: waters and north to northwest, 10 knots or less behind the boundary tonight; north to northeast, 10

to 15 knots on Monday.

SEAS: 2 feet or less in the near-shore sheltered waters, 3 to 5 feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 6 to 8

feet in Atlantic exposed waters tonight, 5 to 7 feet on Monday.

SWELLS: Moderate to light east to southeast swell

PRECIPITATION: There is a medium chance (40%-50%) of widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: A small craft caution is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters.

WINDS: Southerly, 10 to 15 knots tonight; south to southwest, 10 to 15 knots on Monday; southeast to east,

10 to 15 knots Monday night, falling light and variable.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 feet or less in the near-shore sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 4 to

6 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters

SWELLS: Light east to southeast swell

WEATHER: There is a medium to high chance (50%-70%) of scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: A small craft caution is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters.

WINDS: Southerly, 15 knots tonight and Monday, but gusty at times; east to southeast, 10 to 15 knots

Monday night, falling light and variable at times

LOCAL SEAS: 2 feet or less in the near-shore sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 4 to

6 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters. Light east to southeast swell

WEATHER: There is a **medium** chance (40%-50%) of widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:

The North Atlantic hurricane season runs from 01 June to 30 November. Most of the activity tends to occur between **mid-August and mid-October**. Early preparation is key!

Disorganized showers and thunderstorms in the central tropical Atlantic, well west-southwest (WSW) of the Cabo Verde Islands, are associated with an area of low pressure. Additional development is likely over the next several days. This system has a **medium** chance (~40%) of formation through **two (2) days** and a **medium** chance (~50%) of formation through **seven (7) days** as it moves west-northwest (WNW) or northwest (NW) across the central tropical Atlantic. Elsewhere, tropical cyclone formation is NOT expected during the next seven (7) days.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR TUESDAY, 14TH OCTOBER 2025:

ADVISORY: A small craft caution is in effect for the Atlantic-exposed waters in the Northern and Northwest

Bahamas.

Northern Bahamas: Northerly, 10 to 15 knots.

WINDS: Northwest Bahamas: North to northeast, 10 to 15 knots.

Central and Southeast Bahamas: Southerly, 5 to 10 knots ahead of the boundary, falling light

and variable at times; northerly, 10 to 15 knots behind the boundary.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 2 feet or less in the near-shore sheltered waters, 2 to 4 feet

in offshore sheltered waters, and 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic exposed waters.

SEAS: Central and Southeast Bahamas: Less than 2 feet in the near-shore sheltered waters and 2 to 4

feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.

Gulf Stream: 4 to 6 feet

SWELLS: Light northerly swell

PRECIPITATION: There is a low to medium chance (30%-50%) of widely scattered showers and isolated

thunderstorms, mainly in the Northwest, Central, and Southeast Bahamas waters.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR WEDNESDAY, 15TH OCTOBER 2025:

A small craft advisory is in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters in the Northern and Northwest

ADVISORY: Bahamas. A small craft caution is in effect for the Atlantic-exposed waters in the Central and

Southeast Bahamas.

Northern Bahamas: Northerly, 10 to 15 knots.

WINDS: Northwest Bahamas: Northerly, 10 to 15 knots

Central and Southeast Bahamas: Northerly, 10 to 15 knots

Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 1 to 3 feet in the near-shore sheltered waters, 3 to 5 feet in

offshore sheltered waters, and 6 to 8 feet in Atlantic exposed waters.

SEAS: Central and Southeast Bahamas: 2 feet or less in the near-shore sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet

in offshore sheltered waters, and 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic-exposed waters.

Gulf Stream: 5 to 8 feet

SWELLS: Light northerly swell

PRECIPITATION: There is a low to medium chance (30%-40%) of widely scattered showers and isolated

thunderstorms, mainly in the Central and Southeast Bahamas waters.
