



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 06:00 P.M. EDT, WEDNESDAY, 17TH SEPTEMBER 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 06:00 A.M. EDT TOMORROW.

> A slight threat of strong to possibly severe thunderstorms continues for ALL area waters through Friday. These storms have the potential to produce damaging winds, heavy downpours, low visibility, frequent lightning, choppy seas, and possibly waterspout activity. Mariners/boaters are urged to remain vigilant and prepare to seek shelter/safe harbour

WARNINGS: immediately.

> The high risk of rip currents remains in place for all Atlantic-exposed coastal waters, with a moderate risk of rip currents for east-facing coastal waters not directly exposed to the Atlantic; therefore, beachgoers and sea bathers are urged to exercise extreme caution. Mariners and boaters are urged to exercise caution in Atlantic-exposed waters due to swell. Numerous rounds of showers and scattered thunderstorms impact local waters throughout the forecast period courtesy of a slow, northward lifting frontal trough across the Northwest Bahamas, deep tropical moisture and a mid-to-upper-level trough working in tandem.

GENERAL SITUATION: Meanwhile, Atlantic ridging across the islands supports a moderate breeze across the

northern half of the country and a moderate to sometimes fresh breeze across the southern

half of the country.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: During thunderstorms or heavy showers, gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility are likely

WINDS: Easterly, 10 to 15 knots, but quite gusty at times in all waters

2 feet or less in near-shore sheltered waters, 2 to 4 feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 3 to 5 feet **LOCAL SEAS:**

in Atlantic exposed waters

GULF STREAM: 3 to 5 feet tonight; 2 to 3 feet on Thursday

SWELLS: Sight northeast to east swell, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters

There is a medium to high chance (60%-70%) of scattered to numerous showers and **WEATHER:**

thunderstorms

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

Gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility are likely near or in thunderstorms or heavy **ADVISORY:**

showers

WINDS: Easterly, 10 to 15 knots, but quite gusty at times in all waters.

2 feet or less in near-shore sheltered waters, 2 to 4 feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 3 to 5 feet **SEAS:**

in Atlantic exposed waters

SWELLS: Sight northeast to east swell, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters

PRECIPITATION: There is a high chance (70%-80%) of scattered to numerous showers and scattered thunderstorms

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

During thunderstorms or heavy showers, gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility are likely **ADVISORY:**

WINDS: Easterly, 10 to 15 knots but gusty at times, especially in the Atlantic waters

2 to 3 feet in the near-shore sheltered waters, 2 to 4 feet in offshore sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet **LOCAL SEAS:**

in Atlantic exposed waters.

SWELLS: Slight north to northeast swell, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters

There is a low-to-medium chance (30%-40%) of widely scattered showers and isolated **WEATHER:**

thunderstorms.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

A small craft caution is in effect for the Atlantic-exposed waters. During thunderstorms or heavy **ADVISORY:**

showers, gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility are likely.

Easterly, 15 knots tonight, decreasing to 10 to 15 knots on Thursday, but occasionally gusty at times **WINDS:**

in all waters.

2 to 3 feet in the near-shore sheltered waters, 3 to 5 feet in offshore sheltered waters and 4 to 6 feet **LOCAL SEAS:**

in Atlantic exposed waters.

SWELLS: Slight north to northeast swell, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters

WEATHER: There is a low chance (20%-30%) of widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:

There are three areas of interest:

ADVISORY:

SEAS:

- 1. Tropical Storm Gabrielle, at 05:00 pm EDT, was located near latitude 19.4° degrees north and longitude 48.0° degree west or about 990 miles east of the Northern Leeward Islands. Gabrielle is moving toward the northwest (NW) at 14 miles per hour and has sustained maximum winds near 50 miles per hour with higher gusts.
- 2. Disorganized showers and thunderstorms near the Cabo Verde Islands in the eastern tropical North Atlantic are associated with a tropical wave. This system has a low chance (~20%) of formation through seven (7) days as it
- 3. On Friday, a tropical wave is forecast to move off the west coast of Africa. Should this materialize, this system has a low chance (~20%) of formation through seven (7) days as it moves west-northwest across the eastern tropical Atlantic.

Elsewhere, tropical cyclone formation is NOT expected during the next seven (7) days.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY, 19TH SEPTEMBER 2025:

A small craft caution continues for the Atlantic-exposed waters in the Southeast Bahamas. During thunderstorms or heavy showers, gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility are

Northern and **Northwest** Bahamas: Easterly, 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times. WINDS:

Central and Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast, 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at

times.

Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: Less than 2 feet in near-shore sheltered waters, 2 to 3 feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic exposed waters. Southeast Bahamas: 2 feet or less in the near-shore sheltered waters, 2 to 4 feet in offshore sheltered waters

and 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic exposed waters. Gulf Stream: 2 to 3 feet during the day and 3 to 5 feet

at night

SWELLS: Light east swell, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters

There is a medium chance (40%-60%) of widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms PRECIPITATION:

in all waters.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SATURDAY, 20TH SEPTEMBER 2025:

A small craft caution continues for the Atlantic-exposed waters in the Southeast Bahamas. **ADVISORY:** Gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility are likely in or near thunderstorms or heavy

showers

Northern Bahamas: Northeast to east, 5 to 10 knots west of the low and east to southeast, 5 to 10 knots east of the low during the day; easterly, 10 to 15 knots at night. Northwest Bahamas: East to southeast, 10 knots or less in the morning; northeast to east, 10 knots or less in the

WINDS: afternoon; easterly, 10 to 15 knots at night. Central Bahamas: East to southeast, 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times. Southeast Bahamas: Easterly, 10 to 15 knots, but gusty in

Atlantic waters

Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: Less than 2 feet in near-shore sheltered waters, 2

to 3 feet in offshore sheltered waters, and 3 to 5 feet in Atlantic exposed waters. Southeast **SEAS:** Bahamas: 2 feet or less in the near-shore sheltered waters, 2 to 4 feet in offshore sheltered waters

and 4 to 6 feet in Atlantic exposed waters. Gulf Stream: 3 to 5 feet

SWELLS: Light east swell, mainly in Atlantic-exposed waters

There is a medium chance (40%-60%) of widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms **PRECIPITATION:**

in all waters.

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
