# **BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST**

#### MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EDT SATURDAY, JULY 5, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EDT TOMORROW.

- Small Craft Advisory: In effect for Atlantic-exposed waters in the Northern Bahamas. Conditions are hazardous for vessels under 30 feet due to gusty winds and rough seas, with risks of capsizing in thunderstorms. *Safety Recommendation*: Avoid open waters; secure moorings and monitor updates via BDM.
- 2. **Small Craft Caution:** Active for waters in the Northwest, Central, and Southeast Bahamas. Marginally unsafe for small recreational boats, with wave steepness increasing risks. *Safety Recommendation:* Limit travel to sheltered areas; prepare for sudden gusts and reduced visibility.
- 3. Moderate Rip Current Risk (Beach): Applies to Atlantic-exposed and southern coastal waters in the Northern Bahamas; low risk elsewhere. Caused by onshore swells (2-4 feet) and southwesterly winds, posing threats to swimmers. Safety Recommendation: Swim near lifeguards; if caught, swim parallel to the shore to escape.
- 4. **Thunderstorm Warning/Watch (Marine and Beach):** Marginal threat for isolated strong thunderstorms across the Northern and Northwest Bahamas, with potential gusty winds, heavy downpours, frequent lightning, and waterspouts. *Safety Recommendation*: Seek shelter immediately; avoid beaches during storms to prevent lightning strikes.
- 5. **High Surf Advisory:** Possible for northern Atlantic coasts. Hazardous for beachgoers due to strong shore breaks. *Safety Recommendation:* Stay out of the water and avoid rocky areas.

**General Impacts:** Marine activities may face travel disruptions (e.g., ferry delays), coastal flooding in low-lying areas, and reduced visibility (less than 1 NM in heavy rain). Beach activities are at risk from heat indices (95-105°F), urging hydration and shade breaks. No gale or tropical warnings directly affect the area but monitor for updates.

Cloudiness, scattered to widespread showers, and thunderstorms associated with Tropical Storm Chantal will continue to affect the Northern and parts of the Northwestern islands. Meanwhile, a weak high-pressure ridge across the Central and Southeast Bahamas will promote gentle to fresh breezes and generally drier, typical summertime weather. Hazardous marine conditions, including elevated seas and moderate rip current risks, persist in northern waters.

**GENERAL SITUATION:** 

**Outlook:** A strengthening Bermuda High will establish more stable conditions and gentle to moderate breezes across the entire archipelago from Monday through early Tuesday, leading to more isolated, typical summer afternoon showers and thunderstorms. This pattern will be briefly interrupted from mid-Tuesday through early Thursday by a mid-to-upper-level disturbance and associated moisture moving in from the Atlantic, creating elevated instances of showers, thunderstorms, and cloudiness across portions of the island chain. Elevated heat indices will persist throughout the period.

<b>ADVISORY:</b>	A Small Craft Caution continues for all other local waters (including Bimini).
WINDS:	South to southwest at <b>15 to 20 knots</b> with frequent <b>Strong Breeze gusts</b> (22-27 knots) and occasional gusts to <b>Near Gale</b> (28-33 knots) possible, mainly in the Atlantic and Gulf Stream waters this afternoon; becoming southerly at 10 to 15 knots tonight and continuing gusty over open waters.
LOCAL SEAS:	4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere but higher in gusts over the ocean.
<b>GULF STREAM:</b>	1 to 3 feet.
SWELLS:	Light east to southeast swells on the Atlantic-exposed waters.
WEATHER:	A likely (50%-70%) chance of widespread showers and thunderstorms this afternoon, decreasing to a chance (20%-40%) tonight.

#### **TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:**

The official Atlantic hurricane season runs from **June 1 to November 30**. Currently, **Tropical Storm Chantal** (centered near 31.9°N 78.7°W) is the only active system, located well north of The Bahamas but poses **no direct threat to the Bahamas**, with expected landfall in South Carolina overnight. No other tropical cyclone formation is expected in the next seven days.
