



# **BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST**

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

Small Craft Caution is in effect for Atlantic-exposed and nearshore waters in the Northern, Northwest, and Central Bahamas due to winds and seas building, posing risks

to vessels under 26 feet (e.g., capsizing from steep waves).

WARNINGS:

Beach Hazard: Moderate to high risk of rip currents and rough surf along all Atlanticfacing beaches due to onshore winds and moderate swells; swimming is discouraged.

Special Marine Note: Minor coastal flooding is possible in low-lying areas during high

tide due to full moon effects (King Tides); monitor for exposed reefs in large swells.

A weakening stationary front across the Southeastern Bahamas continues to generate isolated showers this afternoon and tonight. Meanwhile, a surface high-pressure ridge anchored over the central Atlantic maintains moderate easterly trade winds across the island chain. Significant long-period swells propagate through the central Atlantic,

affecting exposed Atlantic waters and contributing to rough seas. King tides peak today,

GENERAL SITUATION: causing minor coastal flooding along the east coast during high tide.

**Outlook:** Conditions gradually improve from Friday into Saturday as the front dissipates and winds lighten. However, a **powerful cold front** will approach from the northwest at the beginning of the upcoming week, bringing **fresh-to-strong winds**, **building seas**, and significantly **cooler/drier air** for early next week. Gale-force winds are possible Monday,

prompting potential advisories.

### **NORTHERN BAHAMAS**

### (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** A Small Craft Caution comes into effect this evening for Atlantic and nearshore waters.

WINDS:

Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally higher in gusts this afternoon, increasing to 15 to 20 knots, occasionally higher in gusts tonight over open waters.

LOCAL SEAS:

2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean, building to 4 to 6

feet on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere, but higher in gusts over the ocean tonight.

GULF STREAM: 2 to 4 feet with occasional seas to 5 feet.

**SWELLS:** Moderate northeast and easterly swells, influenced by distant large northerly swells.

WEATHER: There is a very low (<10%) chance of isolated showers.

# NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

# (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: A Small Craft Caution comes into effect this evening for Atlantic and nearshore waters.

WINDS: Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally higher in gusts this afternoon, increasing to 15 to 20

**knots**, occasionally higher in gusts tonight over open waters.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean, building to 4 to 6 feet on

the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere, but higher in gusts over the ocean tonight.

**SWELLS:** Moderate northeast and easterly swells, influenced by distant large northerly swells.

WEATHER: There is a very low (<10%) chance of isolated showers, increasing to a low to medium (20 to 30%)

chance of isolated showers tonight.

### **CENTRAL BAHAMAS**

# (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** None.

WINDS: Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally higher in gusts over open waters. LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean.

**SWELLS:** Moderate northeast and easterly swells.

**WEATHER:** A low to medium (20 to 30%) chance of isolated showers.



#### SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

## (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** None.

WINDS: Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally higher in gusts over open waters. LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean.

**SWELLS:** Light to moderate northeast and easterly swells.

WEATHER: A low to medium (20 to 30%) chance of isolated showers.

# **EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 2025:**

**ADVISORY:** A Small Craft Caution for the Northwest Bahamas (early morning).

Northern Bahamas: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally higher in gusts, falling light and

variable at times by late evening over open waters.

Northwest Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots, occasionally higher in gusts early, becoming southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots, falling light and variable at times by late morning

over open waters.

Central/Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally light and variable

over open waters.

Northern Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the

ocean, falling to 3 feet or less with light and variable winds.

Northwest Bahamas: 4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere over the ocean early, subsiding to 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the

ocean

Central/Southeast Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over

the ocean.

**SWELLS:** All Areas: Light to moderate easterly swells, subsiding.

Northwest/Central Bahamas: A low to medium (20 to 30%) chance of isolated to widely

PRECIPITATION: scattered showers and a low (10 to 20%) chance of isolated thunderstorms.

Northern/Southeast Bahamas: A low (10 to 20%) chance of isolated showers.





# EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2025:

**ADVISORY:** None.

Northern Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times

over open waters.

Northwest Bahamas: South to southwest at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times,

WINDS: becoming west to northwest at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times by late

morning over open waters.

Central/Southeast Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally light and

variable over open waters.

Northern/Northwest Bahamas: .

SEAS: Central/Southeast Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over

the ocean.

**SWELLS:** All Areas: Light northeast to east swells.

**PRECIPITATION:** All Areas: A very low (<10%) chance of isolated showers.
