



# **BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST**

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT THURSDAY, AUGUST 7, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

A surface trough over the Central Bahamas and eastern Cuba, coupled with a weak low-pressure system off the U.S. southeast coast, will sustain shower and thunderstorm activities across the Bahamas today and tonight, with risks of gusty winds and waterspouts. Easterly trade winds under high pressure maintain moderate seas and light to moderate swells, while heat indices surge to 96—104°F in the Central/Southeast Bahamas.

**GENERAL SITUATION:** 

Outlook: The trough will shift westward into the Gulf of Mexico by Friday, leaving lingering moisture to support showers and thunderstorms in the Northwest and Central Bahamas through the weekend. High pressure will dominate by mid-weekend, reducing storm activity and promoting summer-like conditions. Tropical wave AL96 may develop into a depression by Sunday, potentially bringing elevated swells to the eastern Bahamas early next week. Heat and UV risks persist through Saturday, with rip currents remaining moderate along Atlantic-exposed beaches.

# NORTHERN BAHAMAS

### (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: None. Expect gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility in or near heavy showers and

thunderstorms.

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally light and variable at times over open waters.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean.

GULF STREAM:

SWELLS:

Less than 3 feet with occasional seas up to 5 feet.

Light easterly swells on the Atlantic-exposed waters.

WEATHER:

A low to medium (20-40%) chance of isolated to widely scattered showers and a low (10-20%)

chance of isolated thunderstorms.

## **NORTHWEST BAHAMAS**

## (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: None. Expect gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility in or near heavy showers and

thunderstorms.

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally light and variable at times over open waters.

**LOCAL SEAS:** 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean.

**SWELLS:** Light **easterly swells** on the Atlantic-exposed waters.

WEATHER: A medium (30-50%) chance of isolated to widely scattered showers and a low (10-20%) chance

of isolated thunderstorms.

### **CENTRAL BAHAMAS**

## (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: None. Expect gusty winds, higher seas, and reduced visibility in or near heavy showers and

thunderstorms.

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally light and variable at times over open waters.

**LOCAL SEAS:** 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean.

**SWELLS:** Light **northeast to east swells** on the Atlantic-exposed waters.

WEATHER: A low to medium (10-30%) chance of isolated to widely scattered showers and a very low

(<10%) chance of isolated thunderstorms.



#### **SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS**

## (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

There is a Small Craft Caution in effect near Inagua and Turks & Caicos. Expect gusty winds, **ADVISORY:** 

higher seas, and reduced visibility in or near heavy showers and thunderstorms.

Easterly at 15 to 20 knots across the Inagua waters; 10 to 15 knots with higher gusts elsewhere over WINDS:

open waters.

**LOCAL SEAS:** 4 to 6 feet across the Inagua waters; 2 to 4 feet with peaks to 5 feet elsewhere over the ocean.

SWELLS. Light northeast to easterly swells on the Atlantic-exposed waters.

A low (10-20%) chance of isolated to widely scattered showers and a very low (<10%) chance of **WEATHER:**

## TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:

The Atlantic Hurricane Season runs from June 1 through November 30.

**Active Systems:** 

Tropical Storm Dexter: Located over the north-central Atlantic, moving northeast away from the area. No threat to the Bahamas.

Areas of Interest:

WINDS:

- Off Southeast U.S. Coast: Weak low pressure with minimal convection. Formation chance: Low (near 0%) through 48 hours, low (30%) through 7 days. Will remain well offshore.
- Central Tropical Atlantic (AL96): Tropical wave near 35W. Formation chance: Low (10%) through 48 hours, Medium (60%) through 7 days.

7-Day Outlook: No immediate tropical threats to the Bahamas, but monitoring is required for AL96 beyond Day 3.

## EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY, AUGUST 8, 2025:

There is a Small Craft Caution in effect near Inagua. Expect gusty winds, higher seas, and **ADVISORY:** 

reduced visibility in or near heavy showers and thunderstorms.

Northern & Northwest Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally gusts over

open waters.

Central Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally light and variable at times

over open waters.

Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots across the Inagua waters; 10 to 15

**knots** with higher gusts elsewhere over open waters.

Southeast Bahamas: 4 to 6 feet across the Inagua waters; 2 to 4 feet with peaks to 5 feet

elsewhere over the ocean.

**SEAS:** Remainder of The Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over

the ocean.

Light **northeast to easterly swells** on the Atlantic-exposed waters. **SWELLS:** 

A medium to high (30-60%) chance of widely scattered to widespread showers and isolated **PRECIPITATION:** 

thunderstorms across all islands.





## **EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SATURDAY, AUGUST 9, 2025:**

There is a Small Craft Caution in effect near Inagua. Expect gusty winds, higher seas, and ADVISORY:

reduced visibility in or near heavy showers and thunderstorms.

Northern & Northwest Bahamas: Southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally gusts

early, occasionally light and variable at times by afternoon over open waters.

Central Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots, occasionally light and variable at times

**WINDS:** over open waters.

Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots across the Inagua waters; 10 to 15

**knots** with higher gusts elsewhere over open waters.

Southeast Bahamas: 4 to 6 feet across the Inagua waters; 2 to 4 feet with peaks to 5 feet

elsewhere over the ocean.

SEAS: Remainder of The Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over

the ocean.

**SWELLS:** Light **northeast to easterly swells** on the Atlantic-exposed waters.

PRECIPITATION: A medium (30-50%) chance of isolated to widely scattered showers and isolated

thunderstorms across all islands.
