



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 09TH, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS:

NEAR GALE WARNING: There is an increased risk for a near gale-force wind event for the **North Bahamas Monday evening**. Sustained surface winds, or frequent gusts, of 28 to 33 knots (32 to 38 mph; 50 to 61 km/h).

NEAR GALE WATCH: an increased risk for a near gale-force wind event for the **Northwest Bahamas Monday night** for sustained surface winds, or frequent gusts, of 28 to 33 knots (32 to 38 mph; 50 to 61 km/h).

GALE WATCH: is a warning issued when there is a chance of gale-force winds within a specific time frame. Gale-force winds are sustained winds or frequent gusts of 34 to 47 knots (39 to 54 mph). For the **Central Bahamas Tuesday**.

WIND ADVISORY
Near-gale to Gale force wind associated with a strong cold front that will be affecting the Entire Bahamas for the first half of the workweek.

SWELLS:
ENTIRE BAHAMAS - Large swell event to be expected behind the passing of the cold front.

RIP CURRENT:
ENTIRE BAHAMAS: Life-threatening risk for rip currents and rip tides, and strong under tow in association with the wind event.

COASTAL FLOODING & EROSION:
ENTIRE BAHAMAS: High risk for roads and property along the north and eastern coastal areas during the peak high tides.

GENERAL SITUATION:

The tranquil boating conditions will persist today as the high-pressure system weakens, making way for an upcoming strong cold front. A ("COL") is expected to move from the Florida Keys and Gulf Stream across the Bahamas this evening through sunset. Ahead of the front, a pre-frontal trough will cause some instability, but it is not expected to be the main concern during the wind event.

A near-gale to gale-force wind watch is in effect for Monday morning in the North Bahamas, with the potential to upgrade to a warning from Monday night into Tuesday as the front passes through, bringing hazardous to dangerous marine conditions.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: None...becoming a caution overnight for the Atlantic exposed waters.

WINDS: South to southwest 10 to 15 knots today becoming 12 to 18 knots tonight.

LOCAL SEAS: Sheltered areas, open waters and the Northwest Providence Channel- less than 2 feet; The Atlantic exposed waters 3 feet.

GULF STREAM: Less than 2 feet

SWELLS: Light east-northeast swells

WEATHER: There is a low chance of isolated showers and possible thunderstorms

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: None...

WINDS: Light and variable start becoming east to southeast around 10 knots then southeast to south 10 to 15 knots tonight.

LOCAL SEAS: Sheltered areas and open waters - less than 2 feet; the Northeast Providence Channel- 2 to 3 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters 3 feet.

SWELLS: Light northeast swells

WEATHER: There is a low chance of isolated showers and possible thunderstorms



CENTRAL BAHAMAS
(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: None.
WINDS: East to southeast 10 to 15 knots today and tonight.
LOCAL SEAS: Sheltered areas and open waters - less than 2 feet; the Exuma Sound & Crooked Island Passage- 1 to 3 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters 3 feet.
SWELLS: Light east-northeast swells
WEATHER: There is a low chance of isolated showers

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS
(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: Small craft caution for the Atlantic exposed becoming advisory later.
WINDS: East 12 to 18 knots today, becoming east to southeast tonight....
LOCAL SEAS: Sheltered areas and open waters - less than 2 feet; Mayaguana & Caicos Passage- 2 to 3 feet; the Atlantic exposed waters 3 to 4 feet.
SWELLS: Light northeast swells
WEATHER: There is a low chance of isolated showers throughout the day, increasing thunderstorms activity overnight.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:
Official Hurricane Season: June 1 – November 30, 2025. Active Systems: None of concern in the immediate area. Elsewhere: Tropical cyclone formation is not expected during the next 7 days.

**EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10TH, 2025:**

ADVISORY:	North & Northwest Bahamas: Near-gale watch/warning... Central Bahamas: Small craft caution is in effect. Southeast Bahamas: Small craft advisory is in effect.
WINDS:	North Bahamas: Northwest 20 to 30 knots with higher gusts becoming 25 to 35 knots with higher gusts. Northwest Bahamas: Northwest 15 to 20 knots, becoming north 20 to 30 knots with higher gusts. Central Bahamas: Light and variable becoming north 15 to 20 knots. Southeast Bahamas: Light and variable, becoming southwest around 10 knots.
SEAS:	North Bahamas: Sheltered area- less than 2 feet, open waters & Northwest Providence Channel – 2 to 3 feet; and the Atlantic exposure water (north)-4 to 6 feet, east of Abaco – 3 to 4 feet. Northwest & Central Bahamas: Sheltered area & open waters- less than 2 feet; Northeast Providence Channel –2 to 3 feet; the Atlantic exposure water-3 to 4 feet. Southeast Bahamas: Great Bahama Bank & Crooked Is passage- 2 feet; Mayaguana passage- 2 to 4 feet; Caicos passage – 3 to 5 feet and the Atlantic exposed waters – up to 6 feet.
SWELLS:	North Bahamas: Light mixed swells south of the front; northwest to north moderate to large swells north of the front waters. Northwest Bahamas: Light easterly swells Atlantic waters. Central Bahamas: Light east swells Atlantic waters. Southeast Bahamas: Light east swells for open waters and moderate to large east-southeast swells Atlantic waters.
PRECIPITATION:	Northwest Bahamas: Low to moderate risks for showers and possible thunderstorms. Central & Southeast Bahamas: Low risks for showers.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 11TH, 2025:

ADVISORY:	North, Northwest & Southeast Bahamas: Near-gale warning Central Bahamas: Gale warning.
WINDS:	North & Northwest Bahamas: North 20 to 30 knots with higher gusts becoming 25 to 35 knots with higher gusts overnight. Central Bahamas: North 25 to 35 knots with higher gusts Southeast Bahamas: North to northeast 15 to 25 knots with higher gusts.
SEAS:	North Bahamas: Sheltered area- less than 3 feet, open waters & Northwest Providence Channel – 4 to 6 feet; and the Atlantic exposure water & Gulf Stream- 9 to 11 feet. Northwest Bahamas: Sheltered area – less than 2 feet; open waters- 4 to 6 feet; Northeast Providence Channel –5 to 7 feet; the Atlantic exposure water-7 to 9 feet. Central Bahamas: Sheltered area & open waters- 2 to 4 feet; Exuma Sound & Crooked Is passage – 7 to 8 feet; the Atlantic exposure water-up to 9 feet. Southeast Bahamas: Great Bahama Bank(central) & Crooked Is passage- 5 to 7 feet; Mayaguana passage- 4 to 6 feet; Caicos passage – 2 to 4 feet and the Atlantic exposed waters – up to 5 feet.
SWELLS:	North Bahamas: Large northwest to north for the open waters; Dangerous northwest swells for the Atlantic waters. Northwest Bahamas: Moderate to large northwest to north for the open waters; Large to dangerous north swells for the Atlantic waters. Central Bahamas: Moderate to large north swells Atlantic waters. Southeast Bahamas: Moderate to large north swells for open waters and light east-southeast swells Atlantic waters.
PRECIPITATION:	Southeast Bahamas: Moderate risks for showers and thunderstorms.
