BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EDT FRIDAY, MAY 16, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EDT TOMORROW.

Marine Hazards:

- Small Craft Caution: Exercise caution in the Southeast Bahamas due to potentially breezier conditions and slightly higher seas, especially on Sunday.
- Swells: Light easterly swells may create some minor choppiness, mainly in eastern and southeastern exposed waters, but no significant hazardous swells are expected.

Beach Hazards:

- **Rip Currents:** Marginal risk for most beaches. Always swim near a lifeguard and exercise caution near jetties, groins, and piers.
- Heat Advisory: Moderate risk for beachgoers. Heat indices will be in the 90s. Take precautions against heat illness (stay hydrated, seek shade, and limit strenuous activity during peak sun hours). The **High UV Index** (9-10) means sun protection is essential.

General Impacts:

- Marine Activities: Generally favorable across the Northern, Northwest, and Central Bahamas. Mariners in the Southeast Bahamas should monitor for increasing winds and seas by Sunday.
- O Beach Activities: Favorable, but with a strong emphasis on sun and heat safety. Limit sun exposure 10am-4pm.

A broad area of high-pressure centered over the Central Atlantic, extending a ridge southwestward across the Bahamas, dominates the region. This ridge and mid- to upper-level ridging suppresses convection, leading to dry, stable conditions with light to moderate easterly winds. The sea remains generally calm in most areas, with swells primarily from the east.

GENERAL SITUATION:

WARNINGS:

Outlook: Stable conditions persist through tomorrow, with no significant weather systems expected. Winds/seas increase slightly Tuesday–Wednesday. **Saharan dust** may reduce visibility slightly over the southeastern Bahamas by midweek.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory.

WINDS: South to southwest at 10 to 15 knots but falling light and variable at times over open waters.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean.

GULF STREAM: Less than 3 feet.

SWELLS: No significant swells in the Atlantic-exposed waters.

WEATHER: Mostly sunny and hot.

OUTLOOK: Stable conditions and calm seas continue Tuesday.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory.

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 knots or less but falling light and variable at times over open waters.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less over the ocean.

SWELLS: No significant swells in the Atlantic-exposed waters.

WEATHER: Mostly sunny and hot.

OUTLOOK: Stable conditions and calm seas continue Tuesday.



(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory.

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 knots or less but falling light and variable at times over open waters.

LOCAL SEAS: 3 feet or less over the ocean.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory.

WINDS: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots but falling light and variable at times over open waters. LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean.

SWELLS: No significant swells in the Atlantic-exposed waters.

WEATHER: Partly cloudy with isolated showers.

OUTLOOK: Caution advised for higher seas and swells.

Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots but falling light and variable at times over open

waters, possibly nearing 20 knots in gusts.

Northern/Central/Southeast Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet

elsewhere over the ocean.

SEAS: Northwest Bahamas: 3 feet or less over the ocean.

No significant swells in the Atlantic-exposed waters. **SWELLS:** PRECIPITATION: All Areas: No significant precipitation is expected.

over open waters.

Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots but falling light and variable at times

over open waters.

Northern/Southeast Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere

over the ocean

SEAS:

Northwest/Central Bahamas: 3 feet or less over the ocean.

SWELLS: No significant swells in the Atlantic-exposed waters.

PRECIPITATION: Isolated showers (20% chance) in the Southeast Bahamas.
