

BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EDT THURSDAY, OCTOBER 16, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EDT TOMORROW.

Hazardous marine conditions—characterized by rough to very rough seas and large **WARNINGS:**

swells—will persist through the weekend. There is a high risk of life-threatening rip

currents along north- and east-facing beaches; swimming is strongly discouraged.

A reinforcing backdoor cold front, interacting with a strong high-pressure system over the eastern United States and a remnant low, is tightening the pressure gradient across the Bahamas, driving fresh to strong winds and large swells. This has resulted in hazardous marine conditions, particularly rough seas on Atlantic exposures, and a high

GENERAL SITUATION: risk of life-threatening rip currents, while limiting precipitation to isolated showers.

Outlook: Swell-driven seas will peak Friday night into Saturday across all Atlanticexposed waters before gradually subsiding on Sunday as winds ease and shift easterly. A tropical wave may approach the **Southeast Bahamas** early next week (20% development

chance).

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

A Small Craft Advisory for Atlantic-exposed waters and a Small Craft Caution for local/sheltered **ADVISORY:**

WINDS: North to northeast at 15 to 20 knots, with higher gusts overnight.

4 to 6 feet but up to 9 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet but up to 6 feet in swells **LOCAL SEAS:**

elsewhere, but higher in gusts over the ocean.

5 to 7 feet with occasional seas to 9 feet. **GULF STREAM:**

SWELLS: Large **north** to **northeast swells** on the Atlantic-exposed waters.

A low (10-20%) chance of isolated showers and a very low (<10%) chance of isolated **WEATHER:**

thunderstorms; visibility generally good (> 10 nm).

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

A Small Craft Advisory remains in effect for Atlantic-exposed waters; a Small Craft Caution is in **ADVISORY:**

effect for local waters.

North to northeast at 15 to 20 knots, with gusty conditions overnight. WINDS:

4 to 6 feet but up to 8 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet in swells elsewhere, but LOCAL SEAS:

higher in gusts over the ocean.

Moderate to large **north** to **northeast swells** on Atlantic-exposed waters. **SWELLS:**

A low (10-20%) chance of isolated showers and a very low (<10%) chance of isolated **WEATHER:**

thunderstorms; visibility generally good (> 10 nm).

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

A Small Craft Advisory comes into effect tonight for Atlantic-exposed waters. **ADVISORY:**

Northerly at 10 to 15 knots tonight, becoming north to northeast 10 to 15 knots after midnight, WINDS:

increasing to 15 to 20 knots, with gusty conditions tomorrow evening.

2 to 4 feet but up to 7 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere, but higher in

LOCAL SEAS: gusts tonight, building to 4 to 6 feet, but up to 8 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet

elsewhere, but higher in gusts over the ocean tomorrow evening.

SWELLS: Moderate to large **north** to **northeast swells** on Atlantic-exposed waters.

A low (10-20%) chance of isolated showers and a very low (<10%) chance of isolated **WEATHER:**

thunderstorms; visibility generally good (> 10 nm).



SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: A Small Craft Caution is in place for the Atlantic-exposed waters late Friday from spreading swells.

Northerly at 10 knots or less tonight; northeast at 10 to 15 knots, with gusty conditions tomorrow WINDS:

3 feet or less but up to 5 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure tonight, building to 2 to 4 feet but up

to 6 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere, but higher in gusts over the ocean **LOCAL SEAS:**

tomorrow evening.

SWELLS: Moderate to large **north** to **northeast swells** on Atlantic-exposed waters.

A low (10-20%) chance of isolated showers and a very low (<10%) chance of isolated **WEATHER:**

thunderstorms; visibility generally good (> 10 nm).

A Small Craft Advisory continues for all Atlantic-exposed waters. A Small Craft Caution is in **ADVISORY:**

effect for all local/sheltered waters.

Northern & Northwest Bahamas: Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots, with gusty conditions. WINDS: Central & Southeast Bahamas: Northeast to east at 15 to 20 knots, with gusty conditions.

Northern & Northwest Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet but up to 8 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure

and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere, but higher in gusts.

SEAS: Central & Southeast Bahamas: 4 to 6 feet but up to 8 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure

and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere, but higher in gusts over the ocean.

Moderate to large north to northeast swells on Atlantic-exposed waters. **SWELLS:**

Northern & Northwest Bahamas: A low (10-20%) chance of isolated showers and a very low

(<10%) chance of isolated thunderstorms. PRECIPITATION:

Central & Southeast Bahamas: A low to medium (10-30%) chance of isolated to widely

scattered showers and a very low (<10%) chance of isolated thunderstorms.





EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SUNDAY, OCTOBER 19, 2025:

A Small Craft Advisory continues for all Atlantic-exposed waters. A Small Craft Caution is in **ADVISORY:**

effect for all local/sheltered waters.

Northern & Northwest Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots but falling light and

variable at times.

WINDS: Central Bahamas: Northeast to east at 15 to 20 knots.

Southeast Bahamas: East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots.

Northern & Northwest Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet but up to 8 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure

and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere, but higher in gusts.

SEAS: Central & Southeast Bahamas: 4 to 6 feet but up to 9 feet in swells on the Atlantic exposure

and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere, but higher in gusts over the ocean.

Moderate to large **north** to **northeast swells** on Atlantic-exposed waters. **SWELLS:**

Northern & Northwest Bahamas: A low (10–20%) chance of isolated showers and a very low

(<10%) chance of isolated thunderstorms.

PRECIPITATION: Central & Southeast Bahamas: A low to medium (10-30%) chance of isolated to widely

scattered showers and a very low (<10%) chance of isolated thunderstorms.
