

BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 A.M. EDT, Monday, October 6, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 12:00 P.M. EDT.

WARNINGS:	Hazardous marine conditions continue in Atlantic-exposed waters. Large to moderate swells, high surf, dangerous rip currents, and rough seas are expected to impact northern and eastern shorelines through the middle of the week. Beach goers and swimmers are urged not to venture into the waters and mariners/boaters are strongly urged NOT to venture into Atlantic-exposed waters.	
GENERAL SITUATION:	A stalled front will continue to support cloudiness with showers and thunderstorms across portions of the Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas. Moderate to fresh breezes will prevail behind the front while light to gentle breezes flow ahead of the front. Outlook: The large scale pattern is expected to remain the same with an abundance	
	or tropical moisture sparking daily isolated showers and thunderstorms; then a cold front will move into the Northern Bahamas late this week.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY: Small craft operators should remain in port.		
WINDS:	Easterly at 15 to 20 knots.	
LOCAL SEAS: 4 to 6 feet near shore, building up to 12 feet offshore in northeast to easterly swells.		
SWELLS: Moderate to large northeast to easterly swells.		
WEATHER:	40 – 60% chance of a showers and thunderstorms.	

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):			
ADVISORY: A small craft advisory continues for Atlantic exposed waters.			
WINDS:	East to Southeast at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times.		
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet in sheltered areas but building 8 to 10 feet offshore in northeast to easterly swells.		
SWELLS:	Moderate to large northeast to easterly swells.		
WEATHER:	20 – 30% chance of showers and thunderstorms.		

CENTRAL BAHAMAS (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY: A small craft advisory continues for Atlantic exposed waters.		
WINDS:	East to Southeast at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times	
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet in sheltered areas but building 6 to 8 feet offshore in northerly swells.	
SWELLS: Moderate to large northerly swells.		
WEATHER:	30-40% chance of showers and thunderstorms.	

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS (INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):		
ADVISORY: A small craft advisory continues for Atlantic exposed waters.		
WINDS:	East to Southeast at 10 knots or less, falling light and variable at times.	
LOCAL SEAS:	2 to 4 feet nearshore and in sheltered areas, building 7 to 9 feet offshore and along the Atlantic	
EOCHE SERS.	exposures.	
SWELLS:	LLS: Moderate to large northeasterly swells.	
WEATHER:	10% chance of showers.

TROPICAL WEATHER OUTLOOK:	Central Tropical Atlantic (AL95) A broad area of low pressure associated with a low-latitude tropical wave continues to produce a large area of disorganized cloudiness and showers several hundred miles southwest of the Cabo Verde Islands. Environmental conditions appear conducive for gradual development, and a tropical depression is likely to form midweek as it moves quickly across the central tropical Atlantic. This system has a high or 70% chance of tropical cyclone formation during the next seven (7) days.
