



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT SATURDAY MAY 30, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

There is a **slight** risk of rip currents on east and southeastern coastlines of the island chain.

WARNINGS: Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Thunderstorms in the area can become strong to severe at times.

GENERAL SITUATION: Troughing in the vicinity of the Northern Bahamas will support convective activity across the Northern and Northwest Bahamas through Sunday. Elsewhere, a weak pressure pattern persists, supporting the development of localized convection mainly during the hours of maximum daytime heating. Deep moisture will continue to move in from the south, enhancing the potential for showers and thunderstorms while maintaining humid conditions through next week.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No Advisory for seas. Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.
WINDS: Southwest to west at 10 knots with occasional higher gusts.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.
SWELLS: No significant swells.
WEATHER: Widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No Advisory for seas. Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms
WINDS: South to southwest at 10 knots with occasional higher gusts.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.
SWELLS: No significant swells.
WEATHER: Widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: --No Advisory--
WINDS: South-southeast to south-southwest at 10 knots, falling light and variable at times.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.
SWELLS: No significant swells.
WEATHER: Isolated showers.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: --No Advisory--
WINDS: Southeast to south at 10 knots, falling light and variable at times.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.
SWELLS: No significant swells.
WEATHER: Isolated showers.

Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas:

Southwest to west in the Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas and easterly in the Southeast Bahamas at less than 10 knots falling light and variable at times.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

SEAS:

Central and Southeast Bahamas:

1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters; Atlantic waters of the central Bahamas build to 3 to 5 feet on Monday night.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

Widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms.

PRECIPITATION:

Central Bahamas:

Isolated showers and thunderstorms.

Southeast Bahamas:

Isolated showers.
