



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT SUNDAY JULY 05, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

There is a **slight** risk of rip currents on the Atlantic coastal waters of the Southeast Bahamas.

WARNINGS:

Marine Heat Advisory: Mariners are advised that **high heat indices** (above 105°F/40.5°C) are expected across the waters of The Bahamas. Prolonged exposure to the sun and hot conditions may increase the risk of heat-related illnesses. Stay hydrated, limit strenuous activity, seek shade when possible, and monitor crew members and passengers for signs of heat stress.

GENERAL SITUATION:

Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Thunderstorms in the area can become strong-to-severe at times. Weak ridging over the islands continues to steer warm, moist southeast to south winds across the archipelago, maintaining the very warm conditions through mid-week. Winds across the islands are expected to gradually increase during this period. Daytime heating will continue to be the main driver of convective activity across most of the islands; however, the northern movement of Saharan Air will limit much of the rainfall across the Central and Southeastern Bahamas.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** No advisory for seas. *Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.*
- WINDS:** Southeast to south at 10 knots, with occasional higher gusts.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Isolated showers and thunderstorms.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** No advisory for seas. *Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.*
- WINDS:** Southeast at 10 knots, with occasional higher gusts.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Isolated showers and thunderstorms.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** No advisory for seas. *Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.*
- WINDS:** East-southeast at 10 knots, with occasional higher gusts.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Isolated showers with the chance of a few thunderstorms.

**SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS****(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):**

ADVISORY: There is a **small craft caution** in effect for the adjacent waters of Inagua this afternoon. A **small craft advisory** will come into effect for the Atlantic waters, and a **small craft caution** will come into effect for the sheltered waters tonight.

WINDS: Southeast at 10 to 15 knots, with occasional higher gusts this afternoon; winds increase to 15 to 20 knots tonight.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters, 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters this afternoon and 4 to 6 feet on the waters of Inagua this afternoon; seas build 4 to 6 feet on the sheltered waters of the area and 5 to 7 feet on the Atlantic waters tonight.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: A few isolated showers possible with the chance of a thunderstorm.

ADVISORY:

All areas:

Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

Southeast to south at 10 knots, with occasional higher gusts.

Central Bahamas:

WINDS:

Southeast at 10 to 15 knots, with occasional higher gusts.

Southeast Bahamas:

East to southeast at 15 to 20 knots, with occasional higher gusts.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.

Central Bahamas:

SEAS:

2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

Southeast Bahamas:

4 to 6 feet on the sheltered waters and 6 to 8 feet on the Atlantic waters.

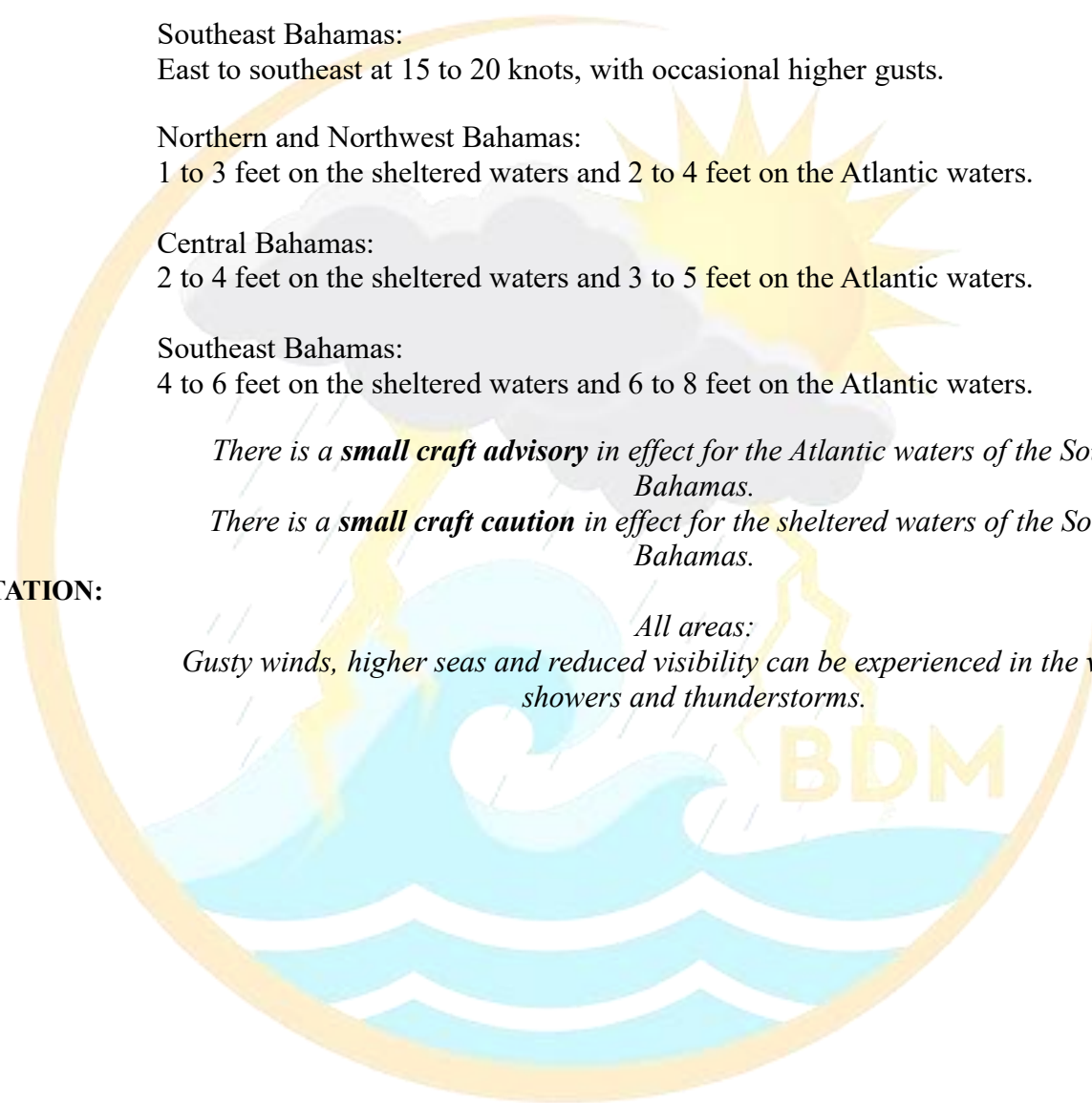

*There is a **small craft advisory** in effect for the Atlantic waters of the Southeast Bahamas.*

*There is a **small craft caution** in effect for all area waters in the Central Bahamas the sheltered waters of the Southeast Bahamas.*

ADVISORY:

All areas:

Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

Southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots, with occasional higher gusts.

WINDS:

Central and Southeast Bahamas:

Southeast at 15 to 20 knots, with higher gusts.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

SEAS:

Central and Southeast Bahamas:

4 to 6 feet across all area waters in the Central Bahamas and on the sheltered waters of the Southeast Bahamas and 6 to 8 feet on the Atlantic waters of the Southeast Bahamas.

PRECIPITATION:

All areas:

Isolated showers and thunderstorms.
