



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT WEDNESDAY JUNE 24, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

- WARNINGS:** There is a **slight to moderate risk** of rip currents for the Atlantic and east to southeastern coastlines of the Southeast Bahamas.
Marine Heat Advisory: Mariners are advised that **high heat indices** (above 105°F/40.5°C) are expected across the waters of The Bahamas. Prolonged exposure to the sun and hot conditions may increase the risk of heat-related illnesses. Stay hydrated, limit strenuous activity, seek shade when possible, and monitor crew members for signs of heat stress.
- GENERAL SITUATION:** Weak ridging will continue to steer warm, moist breezes across the islands through the weekend, while stronger trade winds affect the Southeast Bahamas. Isolated convection is expected, mainly during hours of peak daytime heating.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** No advisory for seas. *Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.*
- WINDS:** Southeast to south at 10 to knots.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Isolated afternoon showers and thunderstorms.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** No advisory for seas. *Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.*
- WINDS:** Southeast at 10 knots.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Isolated afternoon showers and thunderstorms.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** --No Advisory--.
- WINDS:** East-southeast at 10 to 15 knots.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Slight chance for an isolated shower.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

- ADVISORY:** There is a **small craft advisory** in effect for the Atlantic waters. There is a **small craft caution** in effect for the sheltered waters.
- WINDS:** East-southeast at 15 to 20 knots.
- LOCAL SEAS:** 4 to 6 feet on the sheltered waters and 5 to 7 feet on the Atlantic waters.
- SWELLS:** No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
- WEATHER:** Slight chance for an isolated shower.
