



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EDT MONDAY JULY 27, 2026, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EDT TOMORROW.

There is a **slight** to **moderate** risk of rip currents for the Atlantic coastal waters of the Bahamas archipelago as well as east and southeast sheltered coastal waters of the Northern and Northwest Bahamas. **Swimmers ought not to venture into waters where they cannot comfortably stand.**

Rough surf conditions will affect the waters of the island chain through the latter half of the weekend.

WARNINGS:

Marine Heat Advisory: Mariners are advised that **heat indices** around or above 105°F/40.5°C are expected across the waters of The Bahamas. Prolonged exposure to the sun and hot conditions may increase the risk of heat-related illnesses. Stay hydrated, limit strenuous activity, seek shade when possible, and monitor crew members and passengers for signs of heat stress.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Thunderstorms in the area can become strong-to-severe at times; waterspout activity is possible.

GENERAL SITUATION:

Surface to middle level troughing north of the islands is expected to induce widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms across the Northern and Northwest Bahamas through mid-week. Meanwhile, shower and thunderstorm activity across the Central and Southeast Bahamas will be suppressed by low-level ridging which will steer Saharan dust slowly northwestward across those islands.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: **No advisory for seas...** *Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.*

WINDS: Southwest at 10 to 15 knots tonight through Tuesday.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet across all area waters tonight through Tuesday.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms tonight through Tuesday.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: **No advisory for seas...** *Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.*

WINDS: South to southwest at 10 knots tonight, becoming south to southwest at 10 to 15 knots on Tuesday.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet across all area waters tonight through Tuesday.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms tonight through Tuesday.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: **--No Advisory--**

WINDS: South at 10 knots, falling light and variable at times, becoming gusty after midnight. South-southwest on Tuesday at 10 to 15 knots, with occasional higher gusts.

LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic waters tonight, becoming 2 to 4 feet across all area waters on Tuesday.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: Isolated showers with the chance for a few isolated thunderstorms.



SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS
(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: --No Advisory--

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 knots, with occasional higher gusts after midnight tonight, becoming east to southeast at 10 to 15 knots on Tuesday.

LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters tonight, becoming 2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters on Tuesday.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

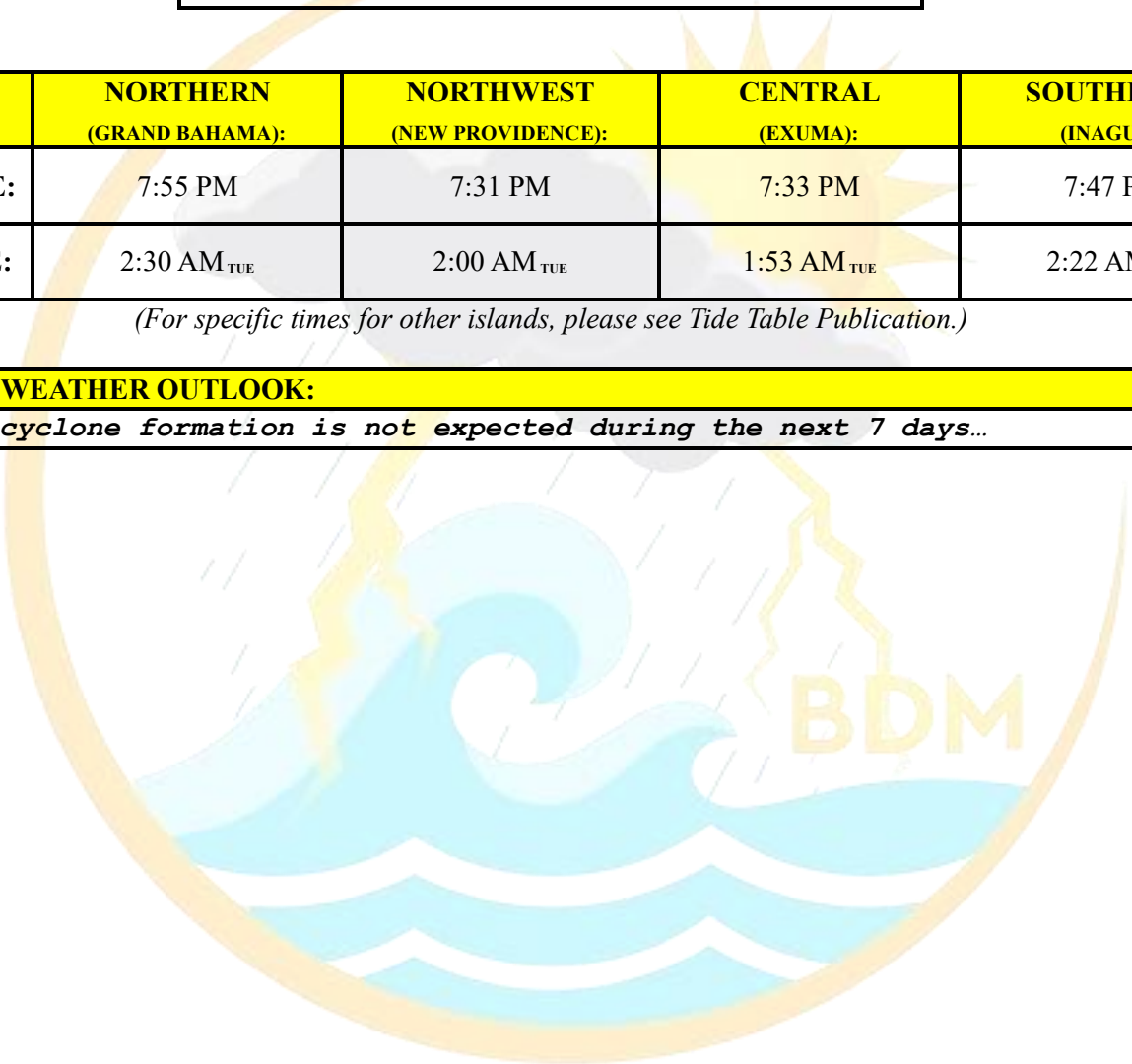

*A **small craft advisory** into effect for the Atlantic and Atlantic exposed waters of the Southeast Bahamas late.*

ADVISORY:

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

South to southwest at 10 to 15 knots, with occasional higher gusts.

Central Bahamas:

WINDS:

South at 10 to 15 knots with occasional higher gusts.

Southeast Bahamas:

East at 10 to 15 knots.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

2 to 4 feet across all area waters.

Central Bahamas:

SEAS:

2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

Southeast Bahamas:

2 to 4 feet nearshore on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters;
Atlantic and Atlantic exposed waters build 6 to 8 feet late.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

Widely scattered showers and thunderstorms.

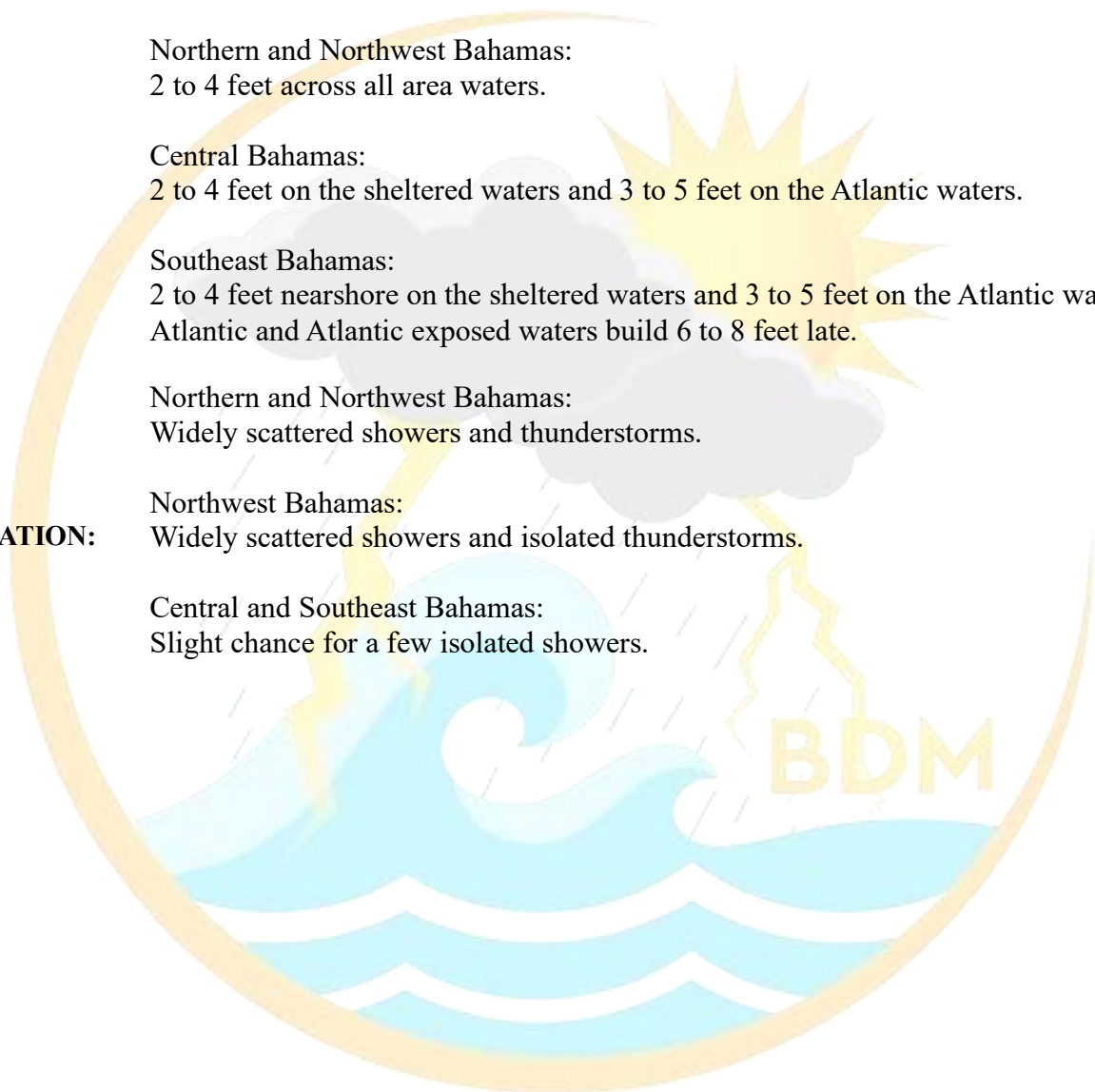
Northwest Bahamas:

Central and Southeast Bahamas:

Slight chance for a few isolated showers.

*There is a **small craft advisory** in effect for the Atlantic and Atlantic exposed waters of the Southeast Bahamas.*

*There is a **small craft caution** in effect for the Atlantic waters of the Centra Bahamas and the sheltered waters of the Southeast Bahamas.*

ADVISORY:

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

Gusty winds, higher seas and reduced visibility can be experienced in the vicinity of showers and thunderstorms.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:
South to southwest at 10 to 15 knots.

WINDS:

Central Bahamas:
Southeast at 10 to 15 knots.

Southeast Bahamas:
East-southeast at 15 to 20 knots.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:
2 to 4 feet across all area waters.

SEAS:

Central Bahamas:
2 to 4 feet nearshore on the sheltered waters, 3 to 5 feet offshore on the sheltered waters and 4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic waters.

Southeast Bahamas:
4 to 6 feet nearshore on the sheltered waters and 5 to 7 feet on the Atlantic waters; Atlantic and Atlantic exposed waters build 6 to 8 feet late.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:
Isolated showers and thunderstorms.

PRECIPITATION:

Central and Southeast Bahamas:
Slight chance for a few isolated showers.
