



BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EDT THURSDAY, JUNE 19, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EDT TOMORROW.

There is an elevated risk of rip currents for the east and southeast coastal waters of the Southeast

Bahamas.

WARNINGS: There is a moderate risk of rip currents for the east and southeast coastal waters of the Northern,

Northwest and Central Bahamas.

Mostly stable and warm conditions will continue due to a persistent ridge of high pressure north of

GENERAL SITUATION: the islands. This system will steer east to southeast moderate to fresh winds across the island into

the weekend. Atmospheric moisture is expected to increase this weekend, increasing the chance for

showers by the latter half of the weekend as the ridge weakens slightly.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory.

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 knots through Friday

LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER:No significant weather tonight. Chance for a few isolated showers with the slight chance for a thunderstorm

on Friday.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory.

WINDS: East-southeast at 10 knots through Friday.

LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters with occasional peaks to 4 feet and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER:

No significant weather tonight. Chance for a few isolated showers with the slight chance for a thunderstorm

on Friday.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory.

WINDS: East-southeast at 10 to 15 knots tonight through Friday.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Great Bahama Bank and the Atlantic waters.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: No significant weather tonight. Chance for a few isolated showers on Friday.

SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS

$(INCLUDING\ INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED\ ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED\ ISLAND\ \&\ ADJACENT\ WATERS):$

ADVISORY: There is a small craft caution in effect through Friday.

WINDS: Easterly at 15 to 20 knots through Friday.

LOCAL SEAS: 4 to 6 feet across all open waters of the area tonight through Friday

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: No significant weather tonight. Chance for a few isolated showers on Friday.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SATURDAY, JUNE 21, 2025:

There is a small craft caution in effect for the Southeast Bahamas.

ADVISORY:

Northern and Northwest Bahamas: East to southeast at around 10 knots.

Central Bahamas:

WINDS: Easterly at 10 to 15 knots.

Southeast Bahamas: Easterly at 15 to 20 knots.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

1 to 3 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

Central Bahamas:

SEAS: 2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

Southeast Bahamas:

4 to 6 feet across all open area waters.

Northern Bahamas: Isolated showers.

PRECIPITATION: Northwest, Central and Southeast Bahamas:

Isolated showers and isolated thunderstorms mainly in the afternoon.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR SUNDAY, JUNE 22, 2025:

There is a small craft caution in effect for the Southeast Bahamas.

Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas: East to southeast at 10 to 15 knots.

WINDS: Southeast Bahamas:

East at 15 to 20 knots.

Northern, Northwest and Central Bahamas:

2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

SEAS: Southeast Bahamas:

4 to 6 feet across all open area waters.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas:

Isolated showers with the chance for an isolated thunderstorm.

PRECIPITATION: Central and Southeast Bahamas:

Chance for a few isolated showers.
