MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 6:00 P.M. EST TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 2025, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 A.M. EST TOMORROW.

WARNINGS:

Rip current risks will increase overnight across the island chain through the latter half of the week

There is a slight risk for rip currents across the island chain tonight.

For Wednesday, the slight risk for rip currents continues in the Northern Bahamas. There will be a moderate risk for rip currents for the waters of the Northwest, Central and Southeast Bahamas.

There is a chance for early morning fog for the Northern and Northwest Bahamas on Wednesday...

GENERAL SITUATION:

High pressure northeast of the islands will gradually strengthen, increasing winds across the island chain through the latter half of the work week; moderate winds across the Northern Bahamas; moderate to fresh winds across the Northwest Bahamas; and fresh to occasional strong winds across the Central and Southeast Bahamas. Surface troughing in the vicinity of the Southeast Bahamas, along with its supporting upper-level trough, will enhance showers across those islands beginning Wednesday through the latter half of the work week.

NORTHERN BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory.
WINDS: North-northeast at less than 10 knots tonight. Northeast at 10 to 15 knots on Wednesday.
LOCAL SEAS: Less than 3 feet across area waters tonight, building 2 to 4 feet on Wednesday.
SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER: No significant weather.

NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory tonight. A small craft caution will come into effect for the Atlantic waters on Wednesday at sunset.
WINDS: North-northeast at less than 10 knots tonight. Northeast to east at 10 to 15 knots on Wednesday, increasing to 15 to 20 Wednesday night.
LOCAL SEAS: 1 to 3 feet across area waters tonight. 2 to 4 feet on Wednesday, becoming 3 to 5 feet on the sheltered waters and 4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic waters Wednesday night.
SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER: No significant weather.

CENTRAL BAHAMAS

(INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory tonight. A small craft caution comes into effect on Wednesday morning at sunrise.
WINDS: East-northeast at 10 to 15 knots tonight. Northeast at 15 to 20 knots on Wednesday with occasional higher gusts.
LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet across area waters tonight, becoming 4 to 6 feet on Wednesday.
SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.
WEATHER: No significant weather.



SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS
(INCLUDING INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED ISLAND & ADJACENT WATERS):

ADVISORY: No advisory tonight. A small craft caution comes into effect on Wednesday morning at sunrise.

WINDS: Northeast at 10 to 15 knots tonight, increasing 15 to 20 knots on Wednesday.

LOCAL SEAS: 2 to 4 feet tonight, becoming 4 to 6 feet on Wednesday.

SWELLS: No significant swells on the Atlantic waters.

WEATHER: No significant weather.

Northern Bahamas:
Northeast at 10 to 15 knots with occasional higher gusts.

WINDS: Northwest, Central and Southeast Bahamas:
Northeast at 15 to 20 knots

Northern Bahamas:
2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

SEAS: Northwest, Central and Southeast Bahamas:
4 to 6 feet across area waters.

Southeast Bahamas:
Isolated showers with the chance for a thunderstorm.

EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 21, 2025:

There is a small craft caution in effect for the Northwest, Central and Southeast Bahamas.

ADVISORY:

Northern Bahamas:

East at 10 to 15 knots. Winds veer southeast on Friday night at less than 10 knots.

Northwest Bahamas:

Northeast to east at 15 to 20 knots. Winds become easterly at 10 to 15 knots on Friday night.

WINDS:

Central and Southeast Bahamas:

East-northeast at 15 to 20 knots.

Northern Bahamas:

2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters.

Northwest Bahamas:

3 to 5 feet on the sheltered waters and 4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic waters; seas fall 2 to 4 feet on the sheltered waters and 3 to 5 feet on the Atlantic waters Friday night.

SEAS:

Central and Southeast Bahamas:

4 to 6 feet across area waters.

Southeast Bahamas:

Isolated showers with the chance for a thunderstorm.

PRECIPITATION:

Elsewhere:

No significant weather.
