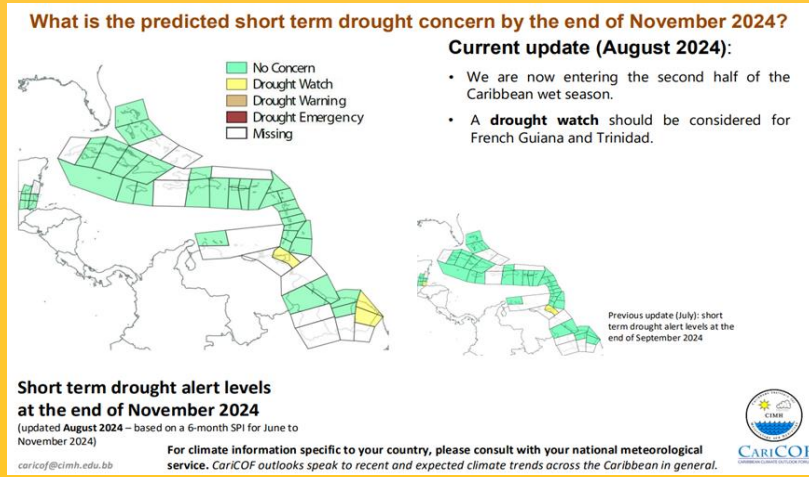


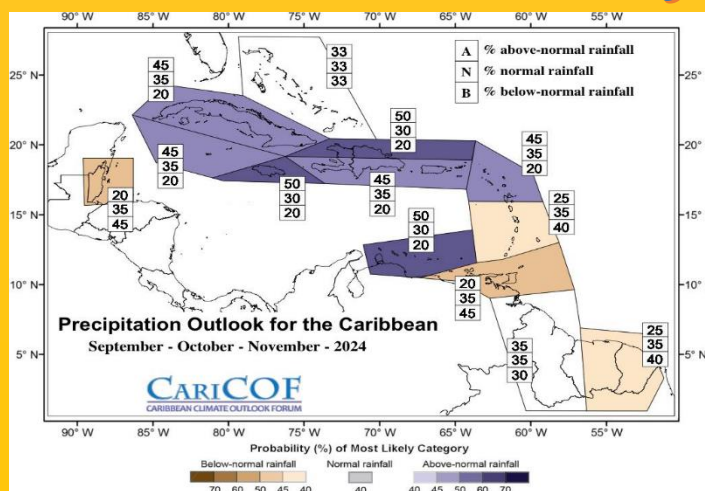
BAHAMAS TEMPERATURE & RAINFALL OUTLOOK

September to November 2024 Drought Outlook



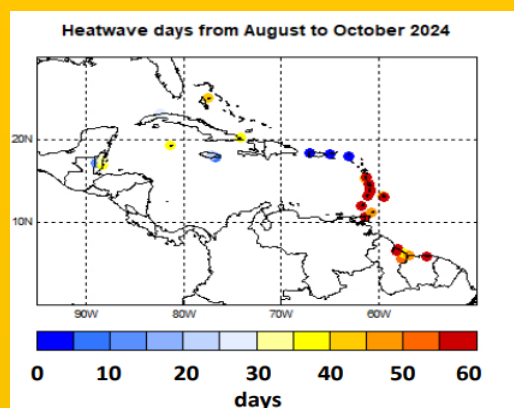
The Bahamas is in an extreme heat season with frequent heatwaves, and with a possible average to above average wet season. There is no concern for drought in The Bahamas through the end of November.

September to November 2024 Rainfall Outlook



Rainfall amounts in The Bahamas for September-October-November period is expected to be near normal.

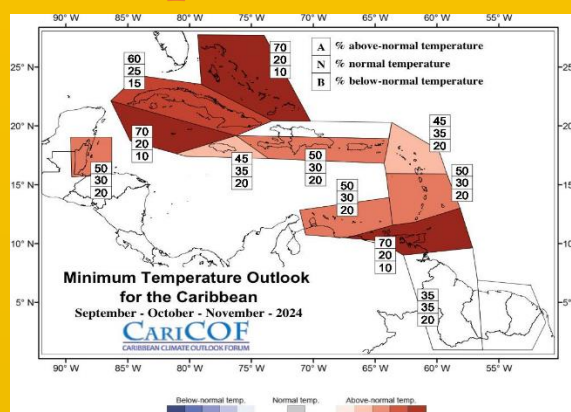
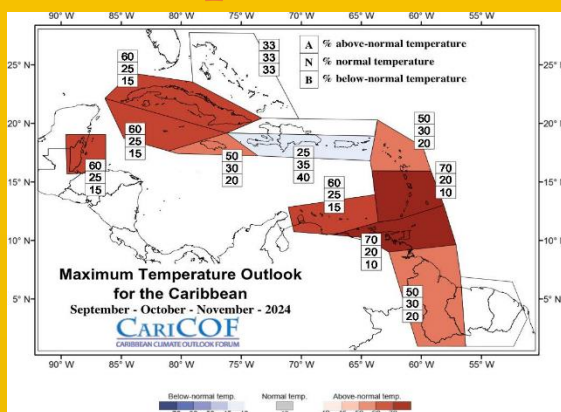
August to September 2024 Heat Outlook



| Heat impact potential | Colour codes | Percentage of time spent in heatwaves |
|-----------------------|--------------|---------------------------------------|
| EXTREMELY HIGH | [Red] | >80% |
| HIGH | [Orange] | 50-80% |
| MODERATE | [Yellow] | 20-50% |
| SLIGHT | [Light Blue] | 10-20% |
| MARGINAL | [Dark Blue] | 0-10% |

25 or 50 heatwave days in are expected in The Bahamas during the forecast period August to September 2024 at least 30 heatwave days in The Bahamas.

September to November Temperature Outlook



During the day, expect significantly air humidity will likely be considerably higher than usual in most areas. Frequent episodes of heat stress are expected the region is likely to continue to be in a record Heat Season through October. Heat stress may further ramp up where dry spells are more frequent than usual.

Climate Outlook December to February 2025

An unseasonably warm Tropical North Atlantic, potentially with La Niña conditions is forecast. Consequently, unusually high air temperatures and humidity remain likely in many locations, but a steady decrease in heat stress is expected in November as the region transitions into the Cool Season by December.
