



# **BAHAMAS MARINE FORECAST**

MARINE FORECASTS FOR THE BAHAMAS ISSUED BY THE BAHAMAS DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY AT 12:00 P.M. EDT WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 2024, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS. THE NEXT SCHEDULED FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AT 6:00 P.M. EDT.

Hazardous Marine Conditions: Gradually building from north to south beginning

Wednesday and peaking on Friday.

A cold front will move across The Bahamas through Thursday. The front will bring showers **GENERAL SITUATION:** 

and thunderstorms mainly in its vicinity, followed by a significant temperature drop. Winds

will increase behind the front with deteriorating marine conditions.

#### NORTHERN BAHAMAS

#### (INCLUDING GRAND BAHAMA, ABACO, BIMINI & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** Small craft caution due to swells and strong winds. WINDS: South to southwest at 15 to 20 knots, with higher gusts.

**LOCAL SEAS:** 4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere, but higher in gusts over the ocean.

**GULF STREAM:** 

Light to moderate northeasterly swells on the Atlantic exposed waters. **SWELLS:** 

Widely scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms in the vicinity of the front. 40-60% chance **WEATHER:** 

of precipitation.

Conditions deteriorate with strong northwest winds and building seas tonight. Cooler and drier **OUTLOOK:** 

conditions post-front.

### NORTHWEST BAHAMAS

#### (INCLUDING NEW PROVIDENCE, ANDROS, THE BERRY ISLANDS, ELEUTHERA & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** Small craft caution due to swells.

South to southwest at 10 to 15 knots but falling light and variable at times. WINDS: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere over the ocean. **LOCAL SEAS:** Light to moderate northeasterly swells on the Atlantic exposed waters. **SWELLS:** 

Widely scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop late this evening. 30-50% chance of **WEATHER:** 

precipitation.

**OUTLOOK:** Deteriorating conditions overnight with increasing northwest winds.

## **CENTRAL BAHAMAS**

## (INCLUDING EXUMA, CAT ISLAND, LONG ISLAND, SAN SALVADOR, RUM CAY & ADJACENT WATERS):

**ADVISORY:** None.

Southeast to south at 10 knots or less but falling light and variable at times. WINDS:

**LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less over the ocean.

Light northeasterly swells on the Atlantic exposed waters. **SWELLS:** 

Partly cloudy, with a chance of isolated showers. 10-30% chance of precipitation. **WEATHER:** 

**OUTLOOK:** The front approaches early morning through midday Thursday with increasing winds and seas.

### **SOUTHEAST BAHAMAS**

### $(INCLUDING\ INAGUA, ACKLINS, CROOKED\ ISLAND, MAYAGUANA, RAGGED\ ISLAND\ \&\ ADJACENT\ WATERS):$

**ADVISORY:** 

WINDS: East to southeast at 10 knots or less but falling light and variable at times.

**LOCAL SEAS:** 3 feet or less over the ocean.

**SWELLS:** Light northeasterly swells on the Atlantic exposed waters.

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy, with a slight chance of isolated showers. 10% chance of precipitation.

**OUTLOOK:** The front approaches late Thursday into Friday with increasing winds and seas.

## **EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 21, 2024:**

**ADVISORY:** Small craft advisory expected for the Northern Bahamas.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Southwest to west at 15 to 20 knots, with higher gusts

ahead of the front, becoming northwest to north at 15 to 25 knots, with higher gusts behind the

WINDS: front

**Central Bahamas:** Southwest to west at 10 to 15 knots, with higher gusts ahead of the front. **Southeast Bahamas:** Southeast to south at 10 to 15 knots but falling light and variable at times.

**Northern and Northwest Bahamas:** 4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere, building to 5 to 8 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 3 to 5 feet elsewhere behind the

**SEAS:** front.

Central and Southeast Bahamas: 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere,

but higher in gusts over the ocean.

PRECIPITATION: 10-20% chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms, mainly in the morning and in the vicinity

of the front.

# EXTENDED FORECAST FOR THE BAHAMAS FOR FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 22, 2024:

**ADVISORY:** Small craft advisory expected for most areas.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas: Northwest to north at 15 to 25 knots, with higher gusts by

afternoon.

WINDS: Central Bahamas: Northwest to north at 15 to 20 knots, with higher gusts behind the front.

Southeast Bahamas: Southwest to west at 10 to 15 knots ahead of the front, becoming northwest

to north at 15 to 20 knots behind the front.

Northern and Northwest Bahamas: 5 to 8 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 3 to 5 feet

elsewhere, higher in gusts.

**SEAS:** Central Bahamas: 4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere, higher in gusts.

**Southeast Bahamas:** 2 to 4 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 1 to 3 feet elsewhere ahead of the front, building to 4 to 6 feet on the Atlantic exposure and 2 to 4 feet elsewhere behind the front.

**PRECIPITATION:** 5-10% chance of isolated showers, mainly in the morning.

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
